

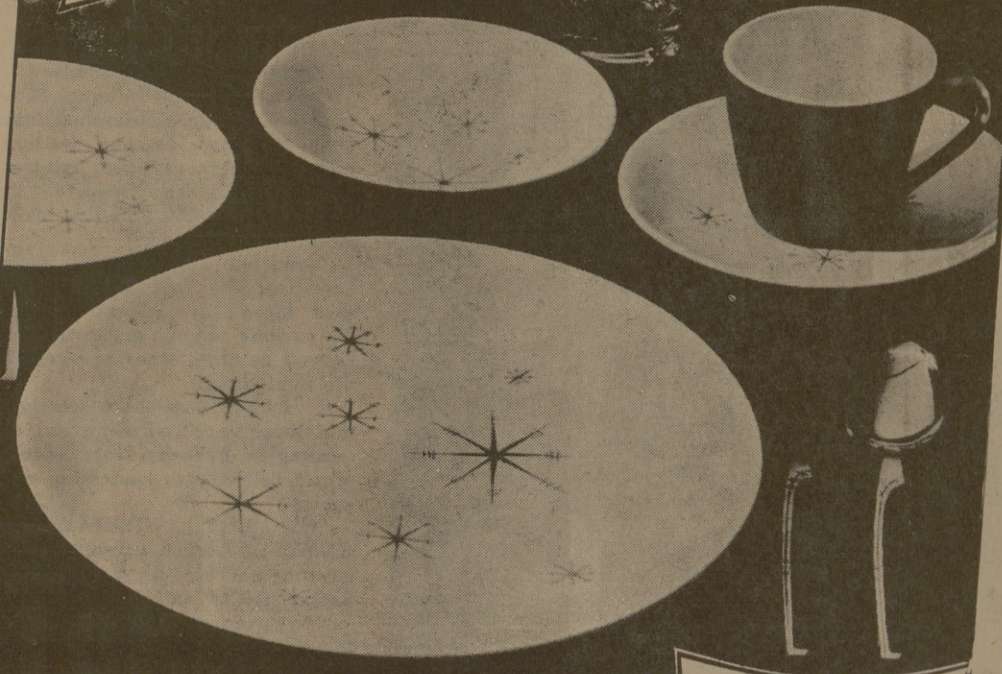

Annex Offers
Telephone
Training

The address is Phoneville.
Don't dig out your almanac.
You won't find it. Phoneville
population is reported as 12
the figure varies.

Phoneville is the name
on Texas A&M's Telephone
Technician Training Center 12
west of the main campus. It
part of the A&M Research
center.

Within its quonset-type
the facility holds \$350,000
telephone equipment. And
equipment is added almost
via donations by manufacturers
and industry.

THE TELEPHONE Techni-
cian Training Program is operat-
ing the Engineering Extension
Service in cooperation with the
Education Agency and the
Telephone Association through
the TTA training committee.

Emphasis, says Chief Ed
Kerlick, is on the practical ap-
proach. His staff teaches courses
taught by telephone industry
leaders and in survey data
collected by the training com-
mittee.

"We try to simulate as
close as possible actual equip-
ment conditions telephone technicians
find in industry," Kerlick
explained. "In this way, we
try to increase an employe's
technical competence and qualify
him for additional responsibilities
related phases of the telephone
industry."

KERLICK EXPECTS 300
from 99 independent telephone
companies to participate in
or more of 17 courses offer-
ing this year at the training cen-
ter. All courses offer approxi-
mately 40 hours instruction.

Enrollment in 1965, the
first year of the program, was 111.
The curriculum ranges from
station installation for new em-
ployees to applied electricity
and schematic interpretation for
experienced men.

"WE'RE TRYING to help
telephone technicians keep pace
with innovations in equipment
and techniques," Kerlick pointed
out. "In many cases, the tele-
phone system has outgrown the
employees. Some men have worked
two or three years, but have
not had the opportunity to learn
the whys of equipment operation.
They have to be able to diagnose
trouble."

"Telephone companies are
trying to give service," he con-
tinued. "They support our training
programs through the training
committee of the Texas Tele-
phone Association."

Assisting Kerlick in training
programs are Kirk Jonas, chief
instructor of the A&M Electron-
ics Institute, training in-
structor Charles Whitaker and
instructor Joe Nail.

PHONEVILLE has both class-
rooms and practical training
facilities. Station installers receive
work orders typical of the indus-
try. They carry out phone installa-
tion orders on simulated houses
under scrutiny of instructors.

Two equipment and training
rooms, each 24 by 60 feet, are
equipped with pay stations, radio
and tone equipment, repeaters
and step-by-step dial equipment
and Kellogg, AE, Stromberg
Carlson and Western Electric
key systems.

Other courses are in the plan-
ning stages as the center keeps
pace with new skills and infor-
mation.
