

Pan Am Awards Grants

The Pan American Petroleum Foundation presented a doctoral fellowship, three undergraduate scholarships and grants here Wednesday.

W. C. Penberthy, Bryan, Texas, received the faculty doctoral fellowship. He will receive more

than \$3,800 in stipends, tuition and fees.

Harrell L. Bilhartz Jr. of Dallas, Craig A. Larson of Brookings, S.D., and William D. Heinze of University City, Mo., were awarded scholarships.

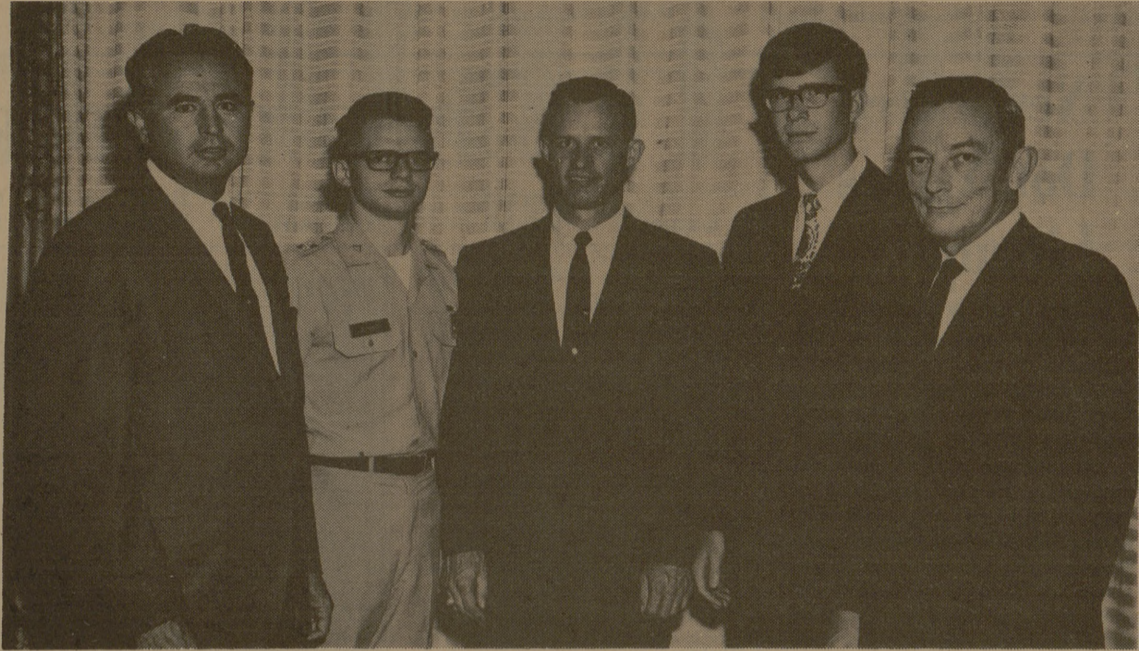
Texas A&M also received a \$1,-

Dr. B. J. Camp, professor in the department, said the program is not listed in the university's new catalog.

He said the program is designed to prepare students for graduate studies in the biological sciences. Students should have strong interest in biology, chemistry and mathematics.

"Opportunities are in such fields as pharmaceuticals, food industry, agricultural chemicals and in government and private research laboratories," the professor said.
