

Cushing Library Receives Books

Maj. Gen. Howard C. Davidson of Washington, D. C., has donated two rare publications to Cushing Library.

Davidson's presentation includes a two-volume copy of the famous Mercator and Hondius Atlas and a Spanish history by Antonio de Herrera, "Historia General de los Hechos de los Castellanos en las Islas Y Terra Firme del Mar Oceano."

The atlas, first printed in Amsterdam in 1639 and re-issued for more than a century, consists of 12 by 19 tomes bound in velum. The volumes contain 232 illustrated maps and charts in addition to text on geography.

"Mercator's projection and the term 'atlas', first popularized in these books, passed into general use and are with us today," noted John Smith, assistant librarian. Herrera's history was printed

in Madrid about 1730. The books are on display at the front door of the library. Following display, the Davidson gift will go into the Cushing special

collection of rare books. Davidson, director of the Air Force Aid Society, attended A&M from 1907 to 1909 and received his B.S. degree at the U.S. Military Academy in 1913. He holds an honorary LL.D. degree in civil engineering from A&M.

Awards are based on high school record, College Entrance Exam Board scholastic aptitude test, physical examination, participation in extracurricular and athletic activities and interviews.

ROTC scholarships pay tuition, books, lab expenses, uniforms and equipment required for military courses and \$50 a month subsistence. Benefits can total between \$5,000 and \$9,000 for the fouryear scholarship in 34 colleges and Universities offering senior division ROTC in the Fourth Army area of Texas, Arkansas, Louisiana, Oklahoma and New

Only cadets who have completed the first two years of fouryear program can compete for two-year scholarships. Selection is based on academic and military records, physical, personal observations and interview. A&M students should apply to Colonel
