> He won the award for heroism in a battle with German SS troops for the fortress city of Sigolsheim, France, Dec. 26, 1944. His citation, in part, stated:

"By his disregard for personal safety, aggressiveness while suffering from severe wounds, determined leadership, and superb courage, Lieutenant Whitely killed nine Germans, captured 23 more and spearheaded an attack doing.


