

**Distance Runners
Tops In Brains**

Distance runners differ from sprinters in several aspects, research at Texas A&M University shows.

Drs. Charles McCandless, C. W. Landis and Donald G. Barker reported on their research in "Perceptual and Motor Skills," publication of Southern Universities Press.

Differences in height, weight, body surface, metabolism, pulse and respiration rate, capacity, blood pressure, vertical jump, reaction time, scholastic aptitude, reading ability and grades were measured in 42 members of a university track team.

Results showed a statistically significant difference in weight, capacity, pulse rates and vertical jump. Distance runners in the group averaged eight pounds lighter, had 500 cubic centimeters more capacity and tended to recover normal pulse rate more rapidly after exertion. Sprinters surpassed distance runners in the vertical jump by four inches.

Distance runners — athletes running events a half mile or more in length — tended to outscore sprinters on most measures of scholastic aptitude and achievement, though not by a significant margin.

McCandless is assistant professor of education and chairs the Education and Psychology Department counseling program. Landis heads A&M's Health and Physical Education Department and Barker is associate professor of education and psychology.

**Longhorns Burn
Candles For Hogs**

AUSTIN (AP)—Aroused Texas students plan to burn red candles and wear orange clothes in their spirited campaign to whip up enthusiasm for the Arkansas game Saturday.

But yards and yards of tape may hold the key to breaking Arkansas' two-year winning streak against the crippled Longhorns.

Most of that tape will be on quarterback Bill Bradley's right leg, supporting the knee which gave way as he cut sharply to avoid a tackler in the Indiana game Oct. 1, causing him to miss the Oklahoma game last Saturday.

Texas coach Darrell Royal said Monday he doubted if Bradley would be ready for the Razorbacks, but the talented sophomore skipped through raised ropes in Tuesday's workout. Sophomore offensive linemen Danny Abbott and Tommy Souders also rejoined the squad but were still moving slowly from old injuries.

Abbott's sore back is wrapped in a corset.

As the Longhorns prepared for the once-beaten Razorbacks, student support mounted. The Daily Texan, the student newspaper, called it a "chain reaction."

Red candles were selling fast at 10 cents each as part of a traditional campaign to hex opponents. Burning the candles worked fine in 1941, 1950 and 1953 when Texas beat Texas A&M, SMU and Baylor in games they were rated to lose. The 1941 victory broke an 18-year winning streak the Aggies had over Texas at College Station. SMU was No. 1 in the nation when it fell to Texas and the candle jinx 23-20 in 1950, and Baylor was No. 3 when the Longhorns won 21-20 in 1953.

Large signs supporting Texas — usually saved for the A&M game — are going up all over the campus, and Friday has been declared "wear orange day." A pep rally is set for that night.

More student tickets have been drawn for the Arkansas game than any game this year.
