

Water Course Scheduled Nov. 14-18

A water technology course is scheduled Nov. 14-18 at Texas A&M's Memorial Student Center. Water works employees with grade "B" or "A" classifications are eligible to attend the 40-hour school taught by Leon Holbert, W. R. Holt and James A. Wilson of A&M's Engineering Extension Service.

Chlorination, water quality, water wells, surface water supply, storage, pumps and motors, water distribution and administration are featured in the curriculum. Chief Instructor Holbert said the course provides technical information in all areas of water operation to help water works employees improve knowledge and job performance.
