Profits Not Goal Of Food Services

The Food Services Dept., setting service to the student above any motive of profit, is enjoying a bare existence these days.

Colonel Fred Dollar, food services director, explained why. "Several new cafeteria lines are planned for Sbsa Dining Hall this next year," he began. "We are not sure, however, that there will be adequate funds to complete the project."

The Food Services Dept. is a non-profit organization. Any profit, as such, goes back into the operation into expansion and improvement. The department, however, makes much less than a commercial restaurant of any kind.

"If we were a profit-making company, we could make the improvements. Our net gains are supplied largely by board fees. We have never been a profit-making organization, since net gain is returned to the students in increased service."

The food department in the Memorial Student Center is also under the direction of the Food Services Dept. The MSC rents out the areas used by the depart-

ment and this increases the department's overhead.

Without the extra operating expenses of the fountain room and cafeteria, the department would have additional capital with which to expand its mess hall service.

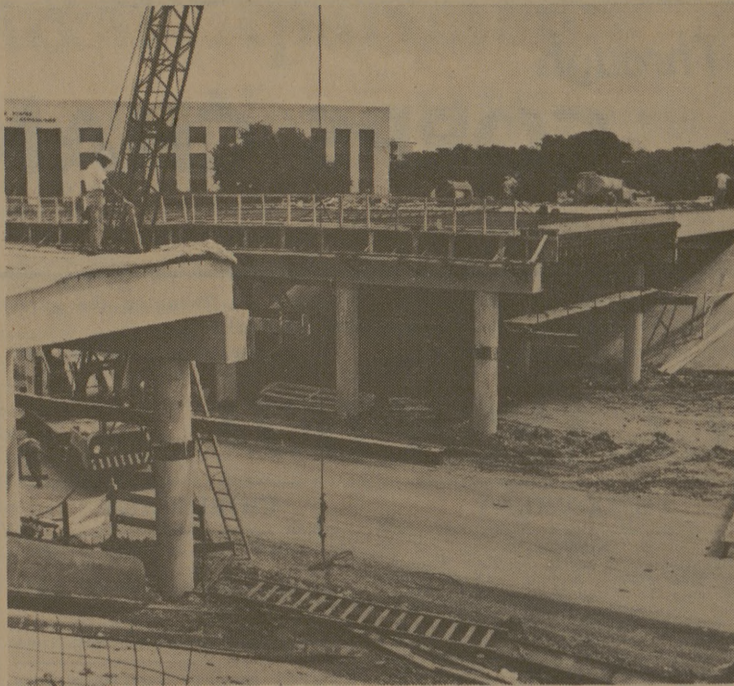
"Our objective is service, rather than net gain which is the objective of any commercial restaurant," Dollar added. "We pay rent at the MSC in order to serve the students. As far as I can determine, we are the lowest priced, all male food service, feeding a balanced diet, in the U.S."

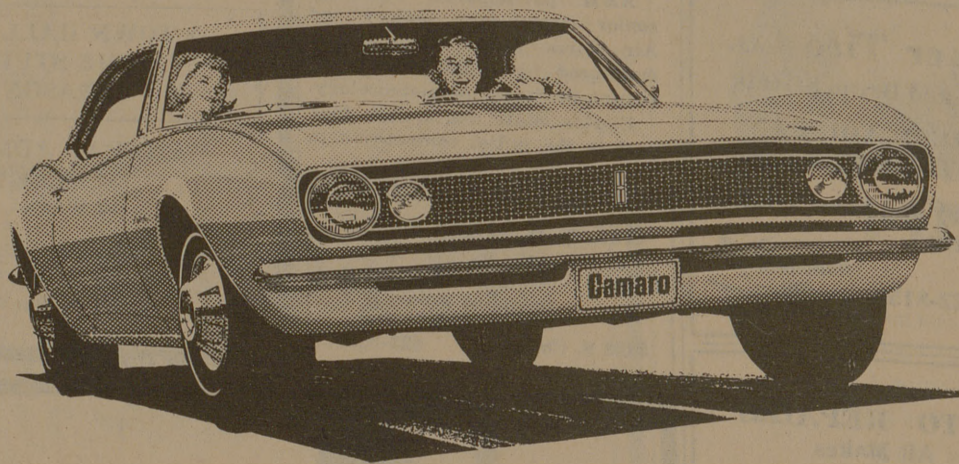

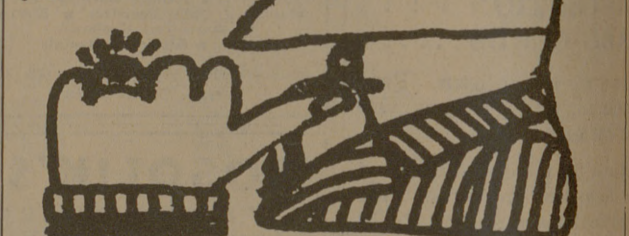
