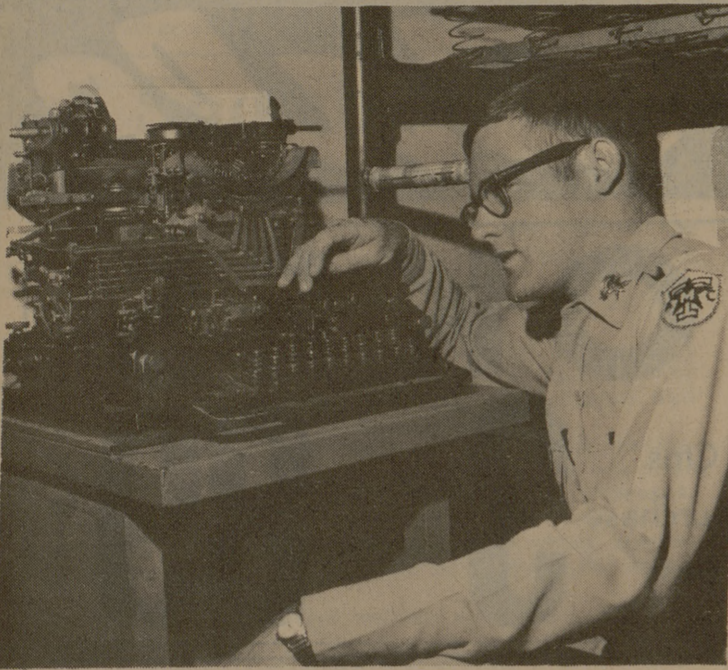


# Senior Builds Teletype For Himself

How does a person intercept foreign codes and save newspaper subscription prices at the same time? It's easy if he has a teletype in his room.

Carey B. Wilson has made his own teletype on which he can produce copy from Associated Press, United Press International, United States Weather Bureau

and Voice of America. The teletype itself was bought by Wilson at an army surplus store, but the receiving equipment that monitors the wire service transmissions is his own work.

"I do not know for sure where the numbers are being transmitted from or even which side is broadcasting them," the red-haired cadet said. "But I have taken bearings which, though rough, indicate that the station is in or around Cuba."

## Teacher Program Receives \$190,500 From Foundation

The National Science Foundation has awarded \$190,500 to Texas A&M's junior high science teacher training program, announced President Earl Rudder. The sixth NSF grant supports A&M's Academic Year Institute for science and mathematics teachers, directed by Dr. J. G. Potter.

The 1967-68 grant will pay 30 junior high teachers stipends of \$3,000 for nine months, plus allowances for dependents, travel, tuition, fees and books.

Teachers under 40 years-of-age with a minimum of three years junior high teaching experience may apply to study at A&M under the program. A minimum "B" average in undergraduate work is required. Applicants should have a year of college-level chemistry and physics, plus a semester each of college algebra and trigonometry. Interested teachers should contact C. M. Loyd, NSF coordinator at A&M.

Most institute course work is applicable toward a master of education degree in science, Dr. Potter noted.

Institute studies include analytical geometry and calculus, oceanography, chemistry, physics, geology, meteorology, astronomy and seminars. Thirty-three teachers from all over the U.S. are currently enrolled in the fifth-year program of the institute.

## Profs Go To Big D

Four professors will represent Texas A&M at the 10th Texas Personnel and Guidance Association Conference in Dallas Friday and Saturday.

Auston Kerley, Dr. Lannes Hope and Ulrich Crow of the Counseling and Testing Center and Dr. Charles McCandless, Education and Psychology Department professor, will attend.

Kerley, center director, is member of a state commission on counseling standards to report on re-evaluation of high school coun-

selor training. Dr. McCandless, chairman of the Education and Psychology Department counseling program, will acquire data for writing a proposal on a personnel and guidance institute at A&M next summer.

Dr. Hope and Crow will represent the center. Among their responsibilities will be maintaining communications with high school counselors.

## Church Group Sets Function

The Lutheran Faculty Conference of the Southwest will be held at the Ramada Inn in College Station on October 21 and 22. This is the third Faculty Conference to be held: the first was in Austin and last year's was in Houston. This is a joint endeavor between Our Saviour's Lutheran Church, representing the National Lutheran Council, and the University Lutheran Church, representing the Missouri Synod.

The theme of this year's conference is Education for Change and the speaker is Reverend Richard Luecke, Director of Studies, The Urban Training Center for Christian Mission, Chicago. The Saturday morning session, "Prophetic Words and Other Speech," and the Saturday afternoon session, "Servant Deeds and Other Actions," are open to all faculty and campus religious workers at Texas A&M University.

## Tulane Chairman To Speak Nov. 8

Dr. Brian McCracken, Physiology Department chairman at Tulane University School of Medicine in New Orleans, will speak Nov. 8 at Texas A&M University.

Hosted by pre-medical and pre-dental societies at Aggeland, the address is sponsored by the American Medical Association, its Council on Foods and Nutrition, and the Texas Medical Association.

Dr. Howard L. Gravett, A&M biology professor and coordinator for Dr. McCracken's visit, said the lecture is part of a series at Southwestern universities designed to bring students, particularly those interested in the health professions, into contact with medical and nutrition scientists.

The talk is scheduled for 7:30 p.m. in Room 113 of the Biological Science Building.

## Supervision Taught

A five-day course in general supervision is now in progress at Texas A&M University. Taught by the Supervisory Development Division of A&M's Engineering Extension Service, the course has attracted approximately 25 participants.

Supervisory problems, performance levels, individual differences, motivation and performance, methods improvements and employe training are among topics of discussion.
