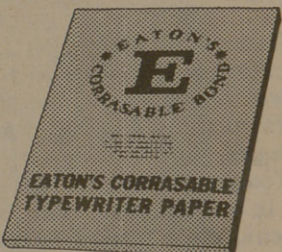

**Big Plays Extend Victories For Aggies —**

**More Stallings 'Tricks' Loom Against Hogs**

Big plays are big business for the Texas Aggies.

Aggie Football Coach Gene Stallings credits big plays for three straight successes in the Southwest Conference.

Baylor, TCU and Texas Tech have fallen victim to the Maroon and White in recent weeks. Sandwiched between was a 7-7 tie with power-laden LSU.

Now comes the biggest test of all for the Aggies. They tangle Saturday night with ninth-ranked Arkansas, a team that breezed to an easy 41-0 victory over Wichita last weekend while A&M was upsetting Baylor, 17-13.

"Our kids have made the big plays," Stallings emphasized. "Take the Baylor game. Tommy Maxwell and Larry Lee made a couple of great catches. We got five interceptions and a fumble; all big plays. They made the difference because we got whipped a lot of times."

"Against TCU, we gave up 20 first downs," Stallings added, "but we made the big plays. We haven't blown folks off the field. We're fifth in offense, sixth in defense in the conference."

Stallings stressed that the Aggies still have room to improve.

"But we can't improve until we get some of our injured players back," he moaned. "Jim Singleton is 99 per cent out of the game. Kovar is out. So is Bill Sallee. And there is no chance for Loyd Curington to return for Arkansas."

The Aggie mentor grimaced and admitted he would welcome an open date. Such a luxury won't be his, however, until Nov. 19, the week before the traditional tussle with Texas.

"I've looked at the Texas-Arkansas film and I don't see how we can budge the ball against them," Stallings remarked. "Boy,

they've got some big ole strong lookin' folks."

Stallings admitted that the Aggies have shown improvement every game, but added that A&M should be at least a 21-point underdog to the Porkers.

"You've got to remember that this is still the same Arkansas team that was the pre-season pick to win the conference championship," Stallings expanded. "Arkansas has a great quarterback in Jon Brittenum. The Razorbacks have an entirely different type of attack than Baylor. They use the sprint out a lot and they have a whole lot of good runners, including the league leader, Bruce Maxwell and Harry Jones."

"I think the prize quote of the year is the one about somebody saying we're a better team than Arkansas," Stallings chuckled. "I don't know of anybody that we could be considered favorites against." (The author of the

Arkansas' vaunted line holds no special fears for the Aggie coach.

"We always go into a game thinking we can run," Stallings commented. "Our staff doesn't want the boys thinking they can get touchdowns the easy way (passing). Besides that, Mo Moorman is not a bad blocker."

Not bad may be the understatement of the year about Moorman. It was the Kentucky giant who unceremoniously dumped Baylor's All America quarterback candidate Terry Southall on the Bears' final play of the game last Saturday. "Mo," as his mates call him, graded 100 per cent on defense and 70 per cent on offense against Baylor. Aggie coaches consider 60 per cent as good.

Moorman played only eight defensive plays against the Bruins, the last one being termed by Stallings as "the biggest play I ever saw."

Stallings make an unintended pun about the Razorbacks while discussing the likelihood of a passing attack.

"Arkansas will stick to its game," he said. "They will probably throw 15 or 16 times, but they won't go 'hog wild' throwing the ball."

About trick or fancy plays, Stallings wouldn't admit to having one cooked up for Arkansas.

"We may put one in," he said seriously. "Every time we've used one, it got us out of a hole. And all of them eventually resulted in touchdowns. We will do whatever it takes to move the ball. I'll tell you this, we don't use trick plays to entertain the crowd."

Stallings confided that he has received a lot of "screwy" plays in the mail recently.

"I read 'em all," he grinned. Right now, Stallings will be

ticked to death if his charges can just keep on making the "big" plays. They have provided mighty big wins for the Aggie
