Every region still has an unbeaten team, with the exception of the Rockies and the unpredictable Southwest. Harvard represents the East; the two top teams in the nation, Notre Dame and Michigan State are still spotless in the Midwest; Alabama, Florida and Georgia Tech have yet to lose in the South; Nebraska has seven in a row in the Plains and Valley, while UCLA remains unblemished in the West.

All of the teams play this week and should make it through, with the exception of Florida. The Gators run up against the Georgia Bulldogs at Jacksonville, Florida, and are ripe for an upset. Michigan State and Notre Dame are involved in two mismatches. State plays Iowa (3-4) and Notre Dame plays Pittsburgh

(1-6).
