



Miss Moore says that injuries are greatest to the legs, arms and head. Most of the deaths are due to head injuries. The possibility of injury is increased when more than one person is riding.

Because a motorcycle rider is more exposed than an automobile driver, he is subject to greater injury in an accident. For this reason, the National Safety Council says it is essential for motorcyclists to wear a helmet, goggles or wind visor, heavy shoes or boots and heavy outer clothing.

Motorcycle registrations have doubled in the past five years. An estimated 1.5 million motorcycles, motor scooters and motor bikes are being operated today. Their use is considered a growing recreational sport. However, in spite of the special skills needed to ride a motorcycle, only five states have special driver's license requirements for a cycle operator. Texas requires both written and
