

# Fish Close Season With Shorthorns

But chances are that the Cotton Bowl host team will be known Saturday and the conference champion just might be established at the same time.

Arkansas goes to Lubbock to play a Texas Tech team that never has beaten it in the nine-year football relationship of the two schools. Arkansas can sack up the Cotton Bowl for the third straight year by keeping its record intact and making it 10 in a row.

However, Arkansas would be the Cotton Bowl team regardless since it has beaten Texas, Southern Methodist and Texas A&M. Besides, A&M couldn't claim a Cotton Bowl spot under any circumstance since it is on NCAA probation.

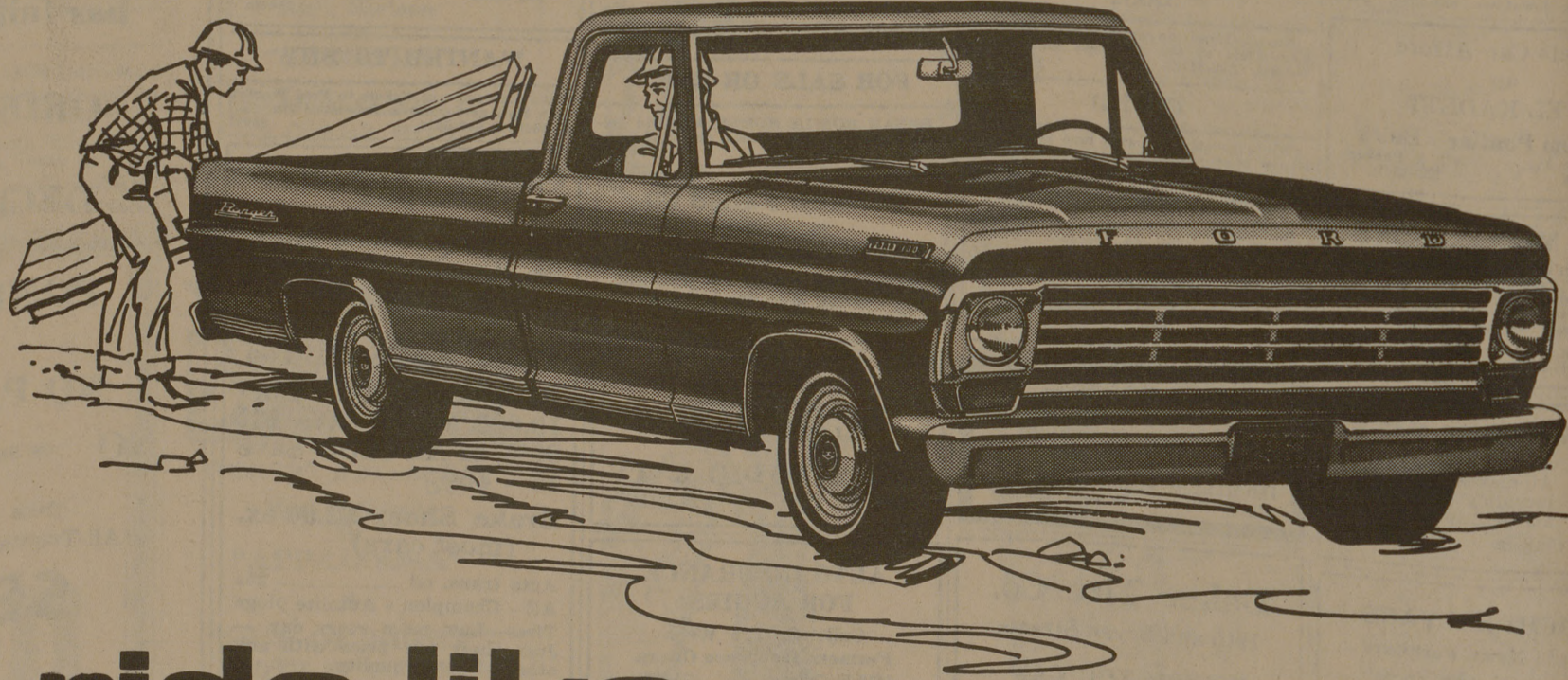
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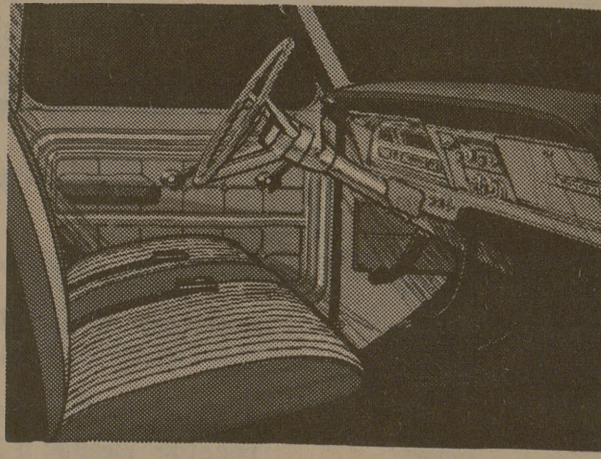


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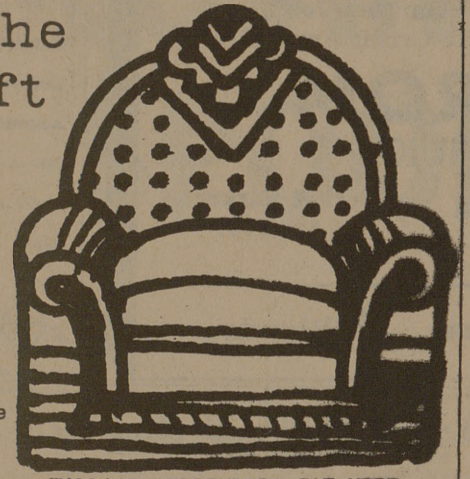
