

Aggies Face NTSU Tonight

 "We're looking forward to a good game," Coach Shelby Metcalf said when discussing tonight's match with the North Texas State Eagles at 8 p.m. in G. Rollie White Coliseum.

The Denton team brings in a 3-2 record and also includes the Missouri Valley Conference leading scorer of last year, Robin Russell. The 6-1 guard leads the team this year with a 21.0 average.

Coach Dan Spika's team has beaten South Dakota, Oklahoma City U., and SW Louisiana, while losing to Trinity and Memphis State.

While Russell and 5-9 Ron Miller present a small guard tandem, the Eagles front line will be made up of 6-8 Willie Davis at center, and 6-7 Hamp Hazleton and 6-5 Matthew Huff at forward.

Metcalf, though happy with his team's performance against Stephen F. Austin Tuesday night, hopes the team's improvement won't halt with that win.

"Things were going right for us, but they (Stephen F. Austin) still kept close," Metcalf said.

Metcalf plans to put in some new wrinkles for this game and hopes they will work out. He has no complaints about the team's effort in the games as he praised each player for hustle.

The Aggie coach is undecided about a starting lineup. He definitely will start Sonny Benefield and John Underwood at the guard spots and Ronnie Peret at one forward position.

Either Buzzy Myatt or Larry Ditto will go at center and Billy Bob Barnett or Terry Trippet at the other forward position.

After Tuesday's win, the statistics show Peret is the leading scorer with 70 points for a 14-point average. He is shooting at a 39.3 percentage on 24 of 61. Barnett is a close second, with 67 points for a 13.4 average and shooting percentage of 43.6 on 24 of 55.

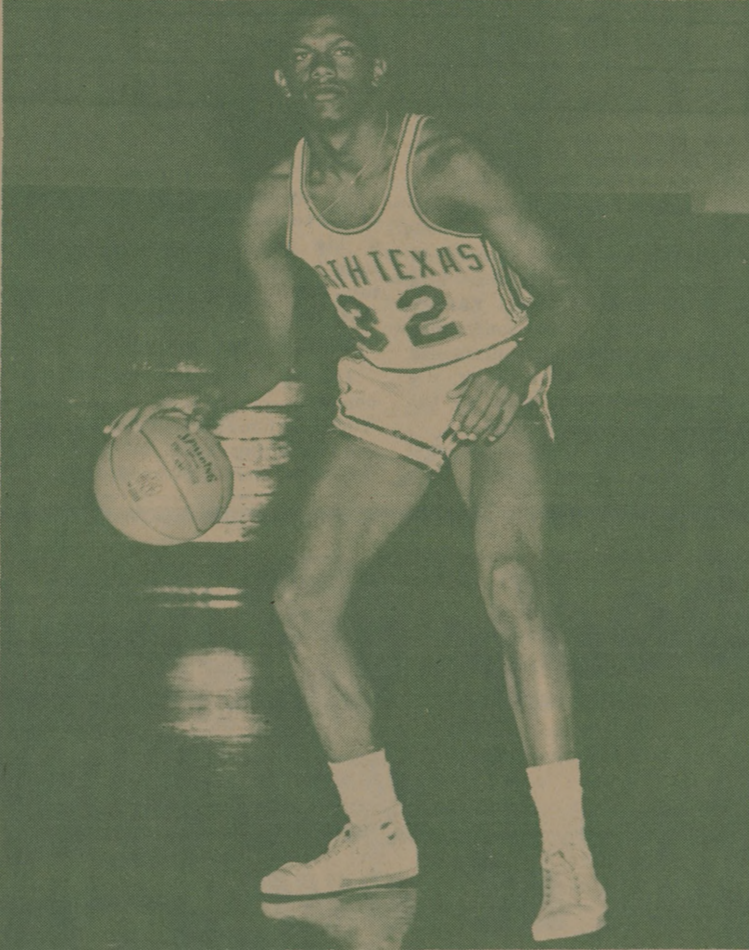
Peret also leads in rebounds with 56 for a 11.2 average. Trippet is second with 32 for a 6.4 average with Barnett third with 30 for a 6.0 average.

Myatt is the top foul shooter with 85 percent accuracy on 17 of 20.

The Aggies are shooting 37.9 as a team and have a 46.2 rebound average. Their 78 total Tuesday night was their high point mark for the season.

Overall, Metcalf feels that things look pretty well for a rebuilding year. He notes that in years passed, the team always had a big scorer to carry them along. This he admits, is a definite disadvantage and the team is aiming to overcome it.

The Fish will also be in action tonight, playing Wharton Junior College. Their game will start at 5:45. Coach Jim Culpepper has set Mac Hooten and Bill Brown to start at the guard positions, Mike Hazel at center, Oliver Biggers and leading-scorer Mike Heitmann, forwards.

Packers Dominate NFL All-Stars

NEW YORK (AP)—Green Bay's Western Conference champions placed eight men on the National Football League All-Star team and the Dallas Cowboys, one step away from the Eastern Conference title, had four men on the first team selected for The Associated Press.

Only nine players repeated from last year's team on the votes of a panel of sports writers and sportscasters, three from each of the 15 league cities.

Bart Starr of Green Bay is the quarterback, Gale Sayers of the Chicago Bears and Leroy Kelly of the Cleveland Browns the running backs and Pat Studstill of Detroit the flanker.

Bob Hayes of Dallas, the world's fastest human, is the split end and John Mackey of Baltimore the tight end. Bob Brown of Philadelphia and Forrest Gregg of Green Bay are the tackles, Jerry Kramer of Green Bay and John Thomas of San Francisco the guards and Mick Tingelhoff of Minnesota the center.

Two of the Los Angeles Rams' front four, end Dave Jones and tackle Merlin Olsen, made the defensive unit. The Packer contingent included end Willie Davis, linebackers Ray Nitschke and Lee Roy Caffey, corner back Herb Adderley and safety Willie Wood.

Larry Wilson of St. Louis is the other safety and Cornell Green of Dallas the other cornerback. Dallas also placed tackle Bob Lilly and linebacker Chuck Howley on the defensive team.

The repeaters are Brown, Gregg, Tingelhoff and Sayers on offense and Jones, Davis, Lilly, Adderley and Wood on defense.
