

Logistics Command Team To Brief Senior Cadets

An Air Force Logistics Command team will brief AFROTC senior cadets Monday, announced Col. Vernon L. Head, professor of aerospace studies.

First Lt. Gordon R. Luce and

1st Lt. Patrick O. Kane from the San Antonio Air Material Area, Kelly AFB, will speak to 100 cadets of five as 400 sections.

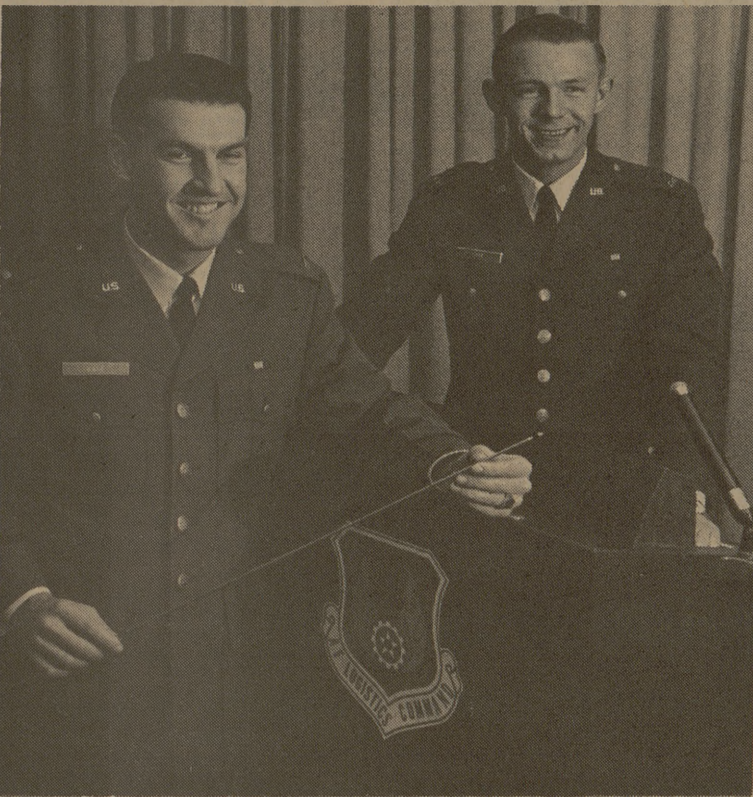
The 40-minute presentation includes 16mm film and 35mm slides, commentary in Huntley-Brinkley style and question-answer session.

"The briefing is designed to educate and motivate cadets for a career in logistics," Colonel Head said. The recently established AFLC program will visit over 60 AFROTC detachments in 23 states and several classes at Lackland AFB officers training school.

AFLC mission, world-wide responsibilities, command composition and logistics functions as related to junior AFLC officers are highlighted in the briefing.

Lieutenant Kane, recently transferred from Oklahoma City Air Material Area, Tinker AFB, is an AFROTC graduate of Loyola University of Los Angeles,

with a degree in business administration. Lieutenant Luce is originally from St. Louis, Mo., and took his commission and bachelor degree in speech and dramatic art at Missouri. He was formerly stationed at Ogden Air Material Area, Hill AFB, Utah.

Texas Prison System Gets Landscape Design Study

A special landscape design study by the School of Architecture has been accepted for use by the Texas Department of Corrections in Huntsville.

Ten students in Prof. Robert F. White's third-year landscape design class presented the six-week study Thursday to A. G. McKain, construction assistant for the TDC.

McKain indicated work will begin this spring to implement proposals of the class.

Included in the study was a revised site plan for landscaping the new TDC administration building area near the main prison unit. Other facets of the project concern construction details, a planting plan, and perspective sketches.

"The study gave our students good practical experience," White said. "They met the client, discussed problems involved in the project, and gained new insight into planting designs."

In accomplishing the study, the class first visited the site to learn existing conditions, then toured the TDC nursery to determine available planting materials. Each student developed individual ideas for three weeks before the class selected a scheme and worked as a team to complete the project.

Landscaping will include plantings of Live Oaks, Shumard Red Oaks, Japanese Star Jasmine, Rotund Holly, Yew Podocarpus, White Redbuds and White Crepe-myrtle.

Other recommendations of the study call for a number of side-

walks for better pedestrian circulation, and patio space near the concession building to accommodate crowds during rodeo season.

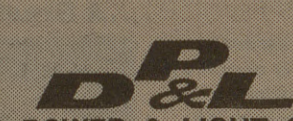

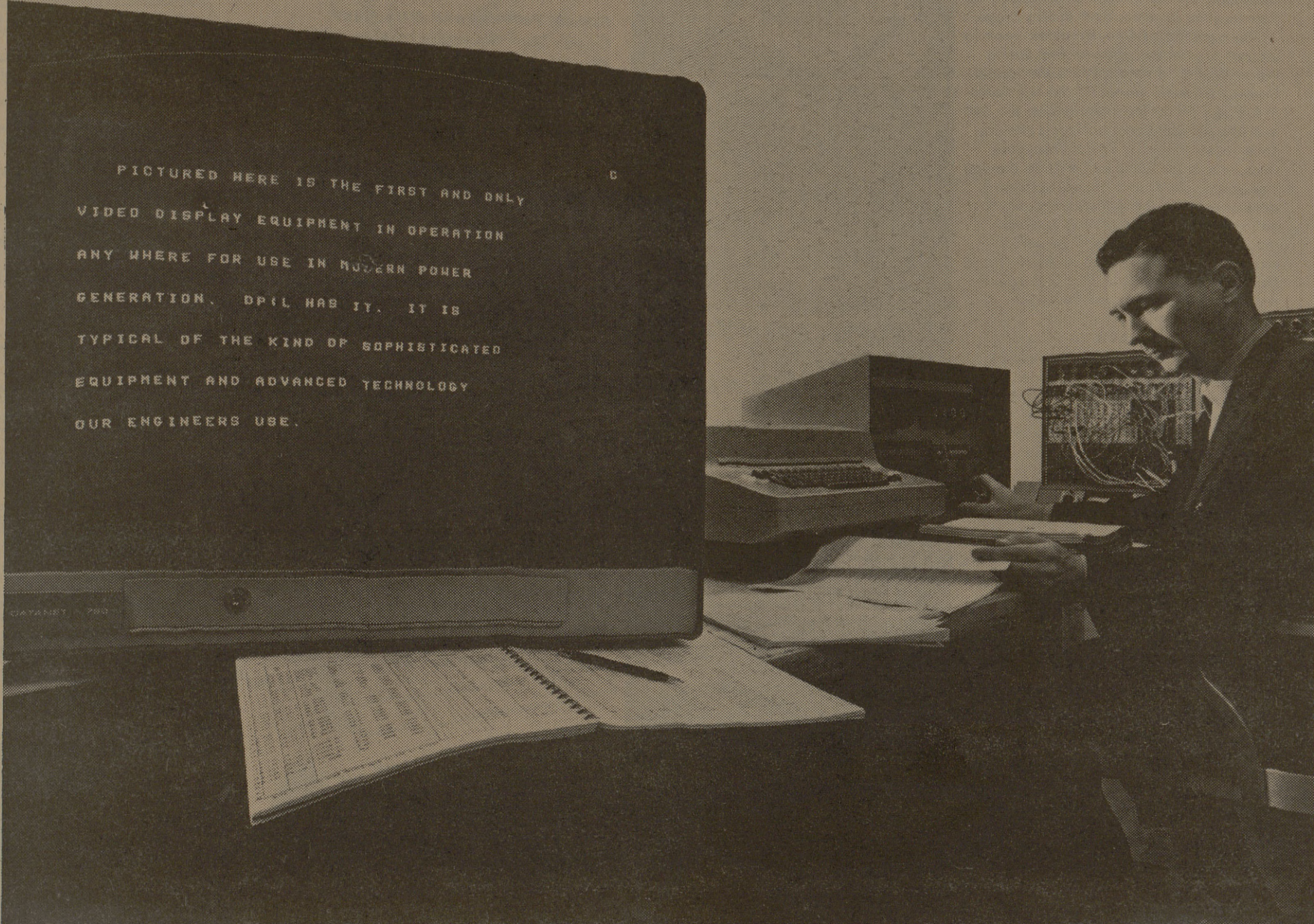
