Engineer Profs Speak In Houston

Two Texas A&M faculty members will speak Thursday night in Houston to the South Texas Section of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers.

Dr. J. George H. Thompson, professor of mechanical engineering, will lead a study group discussing Mohr's Circle. Dr. Harry Sweet, assistant professor of aerospace engineering, will talk about pressure vessels and piping codes as applied to nuclear work.

On Feb. 28, advances in make-up and testing of casings and tubing will be discussed by P. D. Weiner, assistant professor of mechanical engineering, to the South Texas Section Petroleum Group in Houston.

Home Town Stamp Now Gold

Piggly Wiggly today began giving Gold Bond stamps on all purchases, announced store manager Roy Foster.

Foster also said a Gold Bond stamp gift center has been established adjacent to the store.

The Texas Avenue and Rosemary store is discontinuing distribution of S&S stamps in favor of the more widely circulated Gold Bond stamps, Foster explained.

Foster said coupons worth hundreds of Gold Bond stamps will soon be appearing in local newspapers and also will be mailed directly to local residents.
