

Prof To Talk With Seminar This Weekend

Dr. Raymond Reiser, distinguished professor of biochemistry at Texas A&M, will serve as panel moderator for a Cardiovascular Nursing Seminar Saturday at Bryan's Holiday Inn.

The one-day seminar is sponsored by the Brazos County Heart Association, in cooperation with members of Sub-District 9 of the Texas Nurses Association.

Mrs. Betty Anderson, seminar chairman, said the program is primarily designed for registered and licensed vocational nurses in the Bryan-College Station area, but any interested person may attend.

DR. REISER joined Texas A&M in 1940 as a chemist for the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station. He became an associate professor in the university's newly formed Department of Biochemistry and Nutrition in 1947, was promoted to full professor in 1954 and named distinguished professor two years ago.

A native of Philadelphia, he received his B.A. from Western Reserve in 1929 and Ph.D. from Ohio State in 1936. He was a post-doctoral fellow in the School of Medicine at Duke during 1936-40.

Dr. Reiser has been active in local religious and civic affairs, having served as chairman of the Brazos County Tuberculosis Association and co-counselor for the Texas A&M Hillel Foundation.

OTHER KEY participants in the Saturday seminar are Dr. T. T. Walton Jr., Bryan physician; Dr. Douglas W. Terry, an Austin specialist in hematology and internal medicine, and Mrs. Kathryn Guy, a registered nurse at Methodist Hospital in Houston.

Dr. Walter will discuss "Symptoms and Medical Treatment of Myocardial Infarction." Dr. Terry's topic will be "Medical Aspects - Heart Disease" and Mrs. Guy will investigate "Nursing Aspects - Heart Disease."

Registration for the seminar begins at 8 a.m.
