## Zelinsky Describes Poverty Problems

"Handing food to starving people does not cure the disease but merely treats its symptoms," said Texas A&M Graduate College NOR ecturer Dr. Wilbur Zelinsky.

Problems arise because the most backward people are aware of better things and expect advances.

ZELINSKY said areas facing severe and increasingly critical socio-economic pressures are India, South and East Asia-particularly Indonesia, Pakistan, the North and Central Philippines and South Korea - and the West Indies.

He said Egypt, Algeria, Haiti, El Salvador, Northeast Brazil and the Andean highlands of South America bear watching.

Population increases have previously balanced through war, pestilence and famine, international migration and movement within countries.

"One alternative is urbanization. The process is automatic but only partially works. It doesn't keep birth and death rates in balance," Zelinsky noted.

HE SAID direct control of population growth is not a sure system, though results show in limited geographical areas.

"The only foolproof method is large-scale engineering of massive improvements in socio-economic status," the lecturer declared. "Whole populations must be patterned after the European model. It requires an urban, industrial society with progress and acquisitions a strong individual psychological factor.'

construction of water pollution ing.' control plants, a Water Pollution Control Federation official predicted Tuesday at Texas A&M.

"The public can anticipate improved water environment," remarked Dr. Ralph E. Furhman, executive secretary of the 15,000member federation. "Many additions are being made to water pollution control plants throughout the nation to reduce the pollution being discharged into receiving

Furhman spoke to more than 500 delegates attending the 49th Texas Water and Sewage Works Association's Short School. He cited more stringent federal regulations on pollution and increased government support of water pollution control programs as major reasons for improved water qual-

"PRESIDENT JOHNSON has asked for \$203 million in the 1968 budget to support construction of water pollution control plants," Furhman commented. "Some people hope to force construction to an even higher level, but I feel half-a-loaf is better than none. We can seek more funds next

The speaker pointed to the problems of growth in the sanitary engineering field.

"Operations responsibilities in water pollution control plants are growing steadily," Furhman said. "As these responsibilities increase, there is increased pressure for better trained men. I am hopeful the industry will attract more university-trained men to meet these needs."

DR. FURHMAN, a sanitary engineering graduate of Johns Hopkins University, spoke of recent developments by water pollution control plants.

"There is an experimental plant at Lake Tahoe, Nev., which processes polluted water so successfully that it meets Public Health Service standards for drinking
