Texas A&M is offering high school graduates and college freshmen an opportunity to cruise through summer school in a breeze.

The breeze is of the Caribbean and Atlantic variety. The cruise is an 11,400-mile jaunt to Rio de Janeiro, with intermediate stops in such intriguing spots as Puerto Rico and Trinidad.

Boone said the public is invited to view the student projects between 11 a.m. and 3 p.m., May 6, in DeWare Field House.

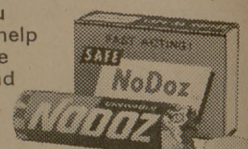
