Rose is NYSTA public relations director and past president of the National School Public Relations Association.

Participants' fees will be defrayed by a Texas Education Agency grant, announced Dr. Paul Hensarling, Education and Psychology Department head.

Participants may receive four semester hours graduate credit through the institute.
