

# Aggies Host Mustangs

The Aggies kickoff a crucial two-game series with Southern Methodist today with a 3 p.m. game at Travis Park.

The two teams will play again Saturday afternoon in a 2 p.m. Travis Park game.

SMU is currently in third place in the close Southwest Conference race and needs both wins to stay alive in the race. Texas is now setting the pace with a 7-2 mark, with Texas Christian setting in second at 6-3. SMU's 7-4

is next, with the Aggies at 4-5 in fourth.

Coach Tom Chandler's crew must win both games or they will be close to being out of contention. A split would still keep their hopes alive, but with six losses it would be hard to catch up.

Last year three teams, including the Aggies, tied for the lead with 9-6 records. This however, was the first time a season had ended with the leader with six losses.

The Mustangs have been up and down this season, as for the first time in many years they have a genuine contender for the SWC baseball crown.

Leading the Ponies into the two-game series will be outfielder Bill Rainer who is tops in the SWC in full season batting with a .402. Rainer, who also plays basketball for SMU, is the only starter in the SWC over .400.

In just conference batting, SMU also has a player up at the top in the batting race. Third-baseman Donnie Denbow is not leading the league, but his lusty .417 average is just two percentage points behind league-leading Pat Brown of Texas.

Leading pitcher for the Mustangs is Bob Flint. Flint is 3-0 in the SWC and 4-1 overall. He has been very stingy with earned runs, as he has a 0.76 ERA in the conference and is 0.98 for the season. Mike Livingston is the second leading chucker with a 4-1 conference record.

The Aggies should face Flint and Livingston in the two-game set.

Chandler will most likely go with Rocky Thompson in one game and probably will start Walter Varvel in the other.

Thompson is 3-2 in the conference and 5-2 overall. The JC transfer from Houston is also the staff workhorse, having pitched 59 2/3 innings this year, 46% of them in conference play.

Varvel is now the top season ERA man as far as starters are concerned, with a 1.88 ERA. The former A&M Consolidated pitcher has yet to be scored on in conference play in the two games he has been used.

said Thursday he would not enter the Army "under any circumstances." This could leave the status of his title in doubt.

Bob Evans, president of the World Boxing Association, said it was too early to make a statement concerning the status of the heavyweight title should Clay be imprisoned for refusing to enter the Army.

Clay, scheduled for induction in Houston April 28, talked at a news conference about his draft situation and recent open housing demonstrations in Louisville.

He was asked if it would be correct to say that he would not enter the Army under any circumstances and he said: "Yes, that is right."

over the darker people the world over," Clay said. "This is the day and age when such evil injustices must come to an end."

Clay, a Black Muslim, was asked if he would take a non-combatant role in the armed services and he replied: "No, sir." The champ said earlier he also would refuse to take the oath of induction.

A draft board spokesman said if this happens, Clay would be required to sign a paper stating that he had refused and the matter then would be turned over to the U. S. district attorney's office for action.

John L. Smith, assistant U. S. district attorney in Louisville, said Clay could receive a maximum of five years in prison for failing to take the oath.
