

# Housley-Led Whites Top Maroons 21-7

On a horse-racing form sheet, there is an indication made if a horse runs well in the mud. If he does, that horse is called a "mudder."

Wendell Housley can also be called a "mudder."

The All-Conference halfback from Richardson led the White team to a 21-7 spring game victory over their Maroon counterparts on a muddy, rain-soaked Kyle Field Saturday afternoon.

Housley racked up 145 yards in 34 carries to brighten up an otherwise dreary, rainy day and give notice to the 3,000 present that he will be a runner to be reckoned with come the '67 Southwest Conference season.

A heavy rain before gametime put some doubt as to how long the game would last but the rains subsided enough to allow the game to be played.

The Maroons led the Whites in total yardage, 275-236 but five White interceptions plus a big third quarter goal-line stand halted any Maroon scoring plans.

It was 7-0, Maroons, early in the game as Coach Dee Powell's boys took little time in scoring. Charlie Riggs hit Jimmy Adams on a thrilling sideline aerial at the White 10-yard stripe. After a Riggs-to-Tommy Buckman pass put the ball nine yards closer at the one, Riggs took the ball in on a sneak and Billy Hobbs' conversion made it 7-0.

Housley then got underway and carried the bulk of the offense in leading a 71-yard drive to tie the score. Housley's two-yard scamper got the touchdown and Tom Sooy added the point.

The next two quarters saw Housley and the opposing Maroon runners run up and down the field but no touchdowns.

With both teams playing even ball at this point, it looked like a definite stalemate between the evenly-matched teams. Early in the fourth quarter, an errant Riggs pass was picked off by White linebacker Lynn Fister. When Fister was finally stopped, the ball was resting on the Maroon six. Housley took the ball in again, with another two-yard run, two plays later.

Now with the score 14-7, the Whites added frosting to the cake as Ed Hargett hit fullback Bruce Kempf with a six-yard scoring pass to cap a 59-yard White drive.

Despite the weather and field conditions, it was a well-played game. Coach Gene Stallings was pleased with the play and praised the players for their hustle. Stallings said that except for Sooy's injury everything else went well. Sooy hurt his knee late in the game and was forced to leave. The seriousness of the injury has not yet been determined, if any.

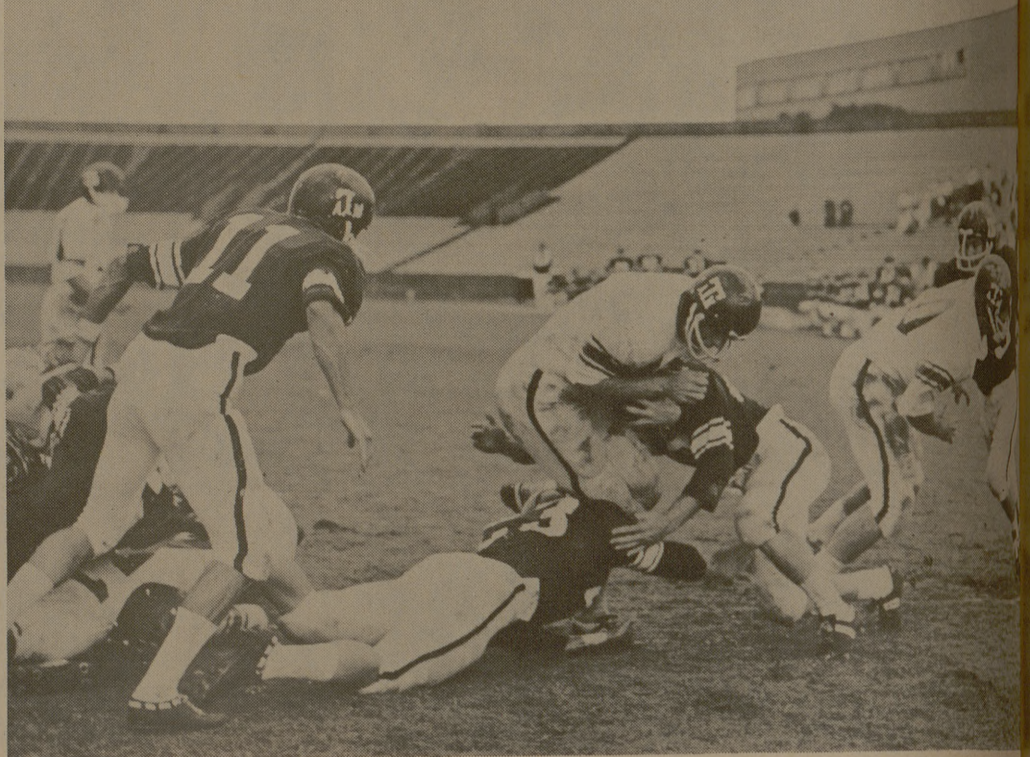
Sooy, redshirt last season, made

a firm bid to take over for the departed Glynn Lindsey's place-kicking chores with a couple of kickoffs and three straight extra points. He also intercepted two

passes and got over to the offense long enough to grab a 10-yard pass.

Riggs completed one less pass in equalling Hargett's 12 attempts

but ended up with 30 yards for 104 yards on six completions. It was a relatively penalty-free game, as only four infractions were called in the game.
