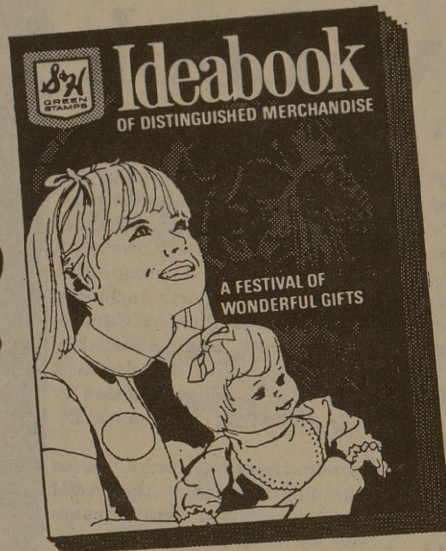

in the traditional sense; he believes that while teaching is appropriate for the classroom, also may be done in almost any location where students and faculty come together. A member of the A&M faculty 19 years, earned two degrees at Southern Texas State Teachers College, later studied at the University of Texas.

The citation for Professor Werth states his course is marked by devotion to the needs of his students, careful preparation and a willingness to make them relevant to the latest search findings in his discipline. He earned two degrees at Southern Texas State University and also studied at The Carnegie Institute of Technology, the University of Pittsburgh and the University of Kentucky. He joined A&M in 1948.

Dr. Hall "has a unique ability to capture the interest of students, even in courses considered to be unusually difficult and uninteresting," according to a colleague quoted in the citation read Tuesday. Born in Chicago, Dr. Hall holds two degrees from Kansas State College and from Michigan State University. Both the University of Arkansas and Michigan State honored him for his teaching accomplishments before he came to A&M in 1948.

Since his association with A&M in the late 1940's, Mackin has received more than \$1.5 million in grants and sponsored research, notes his citation. He also is responsible for the latest and most significant development of shellfish pathology. He earned his undergraduate degree at East Central State College, Ada, Okla., and two graduate degrees from the University of Illinois.

Professor J. W. Sorenson's citation points out his "unique ability and perseverance to approach a research problem from a basic technical concept, and the fundamental facts are established, guide the results to early practical and useful application." He holds two degrees from A&M and another from Iowa State University. He joined the faculty here in 1948.

"This man is primarily responsible for the fact that A&M is among the top 10 universities in the nation as producers of medical students," reads the citation for Dr. Green. It further notes that during time his students were a contained company in the Corps of Cadets, they won the ship flag four times in five years.

Dr. Gravett, who joined A&M in 1946, graduated from James L. Lakin and holds two advanced degrees from the University of Illinois.

Hackney, associated with A&M since 1956, was cited for his leadership and coordination, provides in in-service teaching assistance. This includes extensive courses for teachers conducted on campus and workshops and conferences held throughout the state. Hackney holds degrees from both Baylor and A&M and currently is studying for his Ph.D.

"A distinguished student and an undergraduate here," reads the citation for Dr. Ashby. "he has also distinguished himself as a teacher and researcher by the clarity of his lectures and the diligence with which he attempts to challenge the undergraduates who enter the classroom." He joined the faculty in 1956 after earning his Ph.D. at Columbia.

Dr. Drew's citation notes while "worthy of high praise for his accomplishments in curriculum development, research guidance and student motivation, deserved much recognition for his pioneering development of teaching methods and principles in a discipline (computer science) which is so new and dynamic that national or regional academic, curricular and instructional guidelines do not exist." He joined the faculty in 1961 and holds two degrees from North Texas State University and the doctorate from A&M.

Dr. Hedges' citation notes he has demonstrated "by his efforts that he believes the primary purpose of this university is to provide the best possible program of instruction to its graduate students. This concept has been demonstrated by his success in reorganizing the basic freshman survey course in his department." He graduated from Southern Methodist University, holds two advanced degrees from Iowa State College and conducted post-doctoral research at the University of Texas before joining the A&M faculty in 1957.
