Chartered Bus Stallings To Play To Houston In Golf Tourney Slated June 30

The Texas A&M Memorial Student Center Directorate has announced plans for a charter bus trip to the Astrodome in Houston June 30.

Bill Howell of Brenham, MSC Special Programs chairman, said A&M students will be given first preference in making reservations for the trip.

"The price is \$10 for transportation, a meal and tickets to see the Houston Astros clash with the Los Angeles Dodgers," announced Howell. "Deadline for making reservations at the MSC Student Programs Office is June 30."

The tickets are for reserve seats along the baselines which afford the best baseball view in the dome.

Howell said the activity is first of several available to students this summer at A&M under the MSC Directorate sponsorship.

Astro Facts

Houston Astros outfielder Rusty Staub will be honored by his home state of Louisiana on Saturday night, June 17, prior to the Astros game in the Astrodome with the Tampa Braves, highlighting the Louisiana Weekend celebration. The entire weekend series with Tampa has been proclaimed Louisiana Weekend at the Astrodome. The Braves and Astros meet Friday night at 7:30, Saturday at 1:30 and Sunday at 2:00 p.m.

The Louisiana celebration is scheduled for Saturday's night game when special pennants will be presented to all Louisiana residents, a pre-game musical show the World famous "Los Troubadours" group from Madrid, Spain, who are also appearing at the Louisiana State Fair, and the presentation to Staub.

The Sunday, June 18 game will be "Family Day" with all children, young or under and accompanied by parents, receiving a one-dollar ticket on box and reserved seats. Staub, the 23-year old native New Orleans, is the Astros' first baseman and "Most Valuable Player" of 1966. He also has a chance to be selected to the All-Star team.

Other games in the Astros' home stand include games against the San Francisco Giants, June 12, 13, 14 and 15, the St. Louis Cardinals, June 19 and 20, and the Cincinnati Reds on June 21.

Tickets for the big weekend and Astros home games may be purchased by mailing check or by order to Tickets, Houston Astros, P. O. Box 1691, Houston. They may be purchased at the Astrodome and most Trans-Texas ways counters throughout the state. Box seats are \$3.50 and reserved seats are \$2.50.

Texas A&M football coach Gene Stallings will join a solid national field of 26 head football coaches and 25 to 30 of the country's top sportswriters in the Third Annual Coaches' Invitational Golf Tournament at Cherokee Village, Arkansas, June 20-22.

The 54-hole tournament will include coaches from eight conferences — the Southwest, Big Eight, Southeastern, Big Ten, Atlantic, Missouri Valley, Pacific Coast, Southland—and several major independents.

The coaches and sportswriters will compete in separate brackets, with 18 holes of practice set for Tuesday and 27 holes of competition on Wednesday and Thursday. Co-hosts for the annual event are University of Arkansas head football coach Frank Broyles, and John Cooper of Cherokee Village.

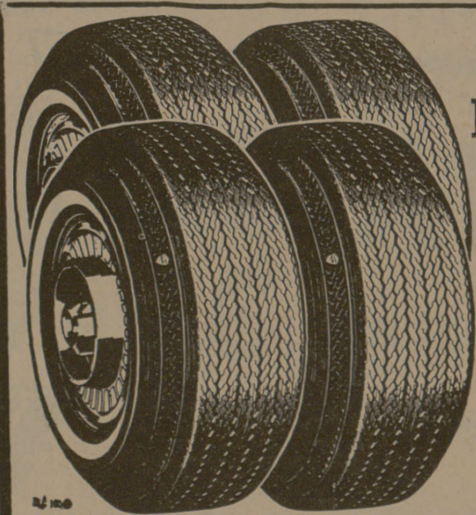

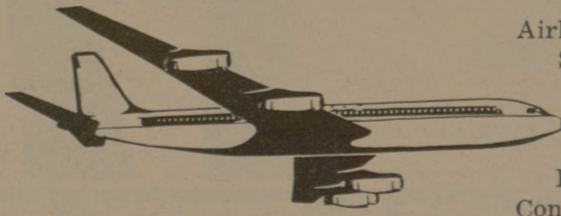
