Dr. Hall To Attend Dominican Eve

Dr. Wayne C. Hall, A&M's academic vice president, will represent President Rudder in the first commencement exercises of Universidad Catolica Madre and Maestra in Santiago, Dominican Republic.

Dr. Hall is scheduled to arrive in Santiago through Tuesday. He will inspect facilities recently constructed on new university property in the south part of the city.

"Texas A&M faculty members have been good friends of the university since its establishment four years ago," commented Dr. G. M. Watkins, A&M's international relations director for A&M's International Programs Office. "Our people served as informal consultants from time to time, but we have no official connections."

Dr. Watkins estimated that the university has approximately 100 in electrical engineering, business administration, and arts and sciences.

Dr. Watkins said that his activities will include details of the new facilities under construction.

"The university has been the quarters of a girls' college for classes," Watkins explained. "The girls' college has been the quarters during the last two years of the university conducted there in the late afternoon evening."
