

22 Internships Are Produced By A&M Dept.

Twenty-two students are participating in a summer training program as a part of the curriculum of the Texas A&M Recreation and Parks Department.

The students are working some of the major federal, county and municipal park recreation systems throughout the nation.

Dr. L. M. Reid, head of the A&M Recreation and Parks Department said the purpose of the "internship" is to give the group practical experience.

"Exposure to various philosophies of park and recreation administration is a prime objective," Reid said, "and both the university and participating agencies work closely to arrange a summer program which is a challenging and stimulating experience for the interns."

The students spend considerable time on planning, financing and administering park and recreation systems.

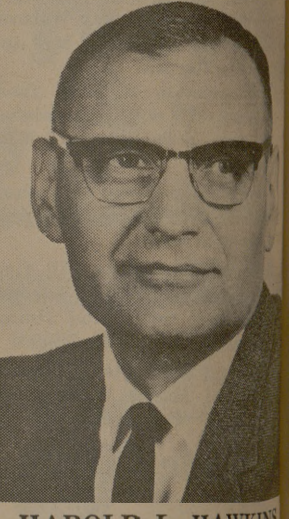
"They may become involved in such problem areas as over-use of facilities and collecting user fees as well as carrying out major responsibilities in nature interpretation, maintenance and operation of facilities, and personnel relations," Reid said.

He added that each student is asked to select a park administration and development topic for class presentation and course credit after returning to A&M.

Out-of-state agencies employing A&M students this summer are the National Park Service (Rainier and Yellowstone); Fairfax, Virginia County Park Authority; Wheeling, West Virginia Park and Recreation Department; and the Sunnyvale, California Park and Recreation Department.

In Texas, seven students are working in Huntsville, Palo Duro Lake, Whitney, LBJ and Corpus Christi State Parks. U. S. Forest Service is employing three in recreation jobs in national forests. Others are working with the Dallas, Fort Worth, Austin and Bryan Park and Recreation Departments.

"This is the first year for an internship program, and 40 requests for summer students were made by park and recreation departments throughout the country, with some 70 positions for park and recreation majors," Reid said.



Head of Schools Named To Post

Dr. Harold L. Hawkins, superintendent of Olean, N. Y., will join the Texas A&M Education and Psychology Department Sept. 1 as an associate professor and head.

The 45-year-old superintendent will instruct in specialties for peritendancy and will help strengthen our Ph.D. program in educational administration," Hensarling said. The position is a new one provided by A&M departmental growth competition.

Hawkins participated in a Harvard experimental program for school administrators preparing one of 20 U. S. educators selected by the Cambridge, Mass., city.

"The program has become a model for administrative education," Hensarling added.

Hawkins was awarded his Ph.D. at Harvard in 1958, with honors and masters degrees from Eastern Michigan and the University of Michigan. He farmed and constructed at the elementary school in Michigan, where he was superintendent at several Michigan schools and an Air Force school in Spain.

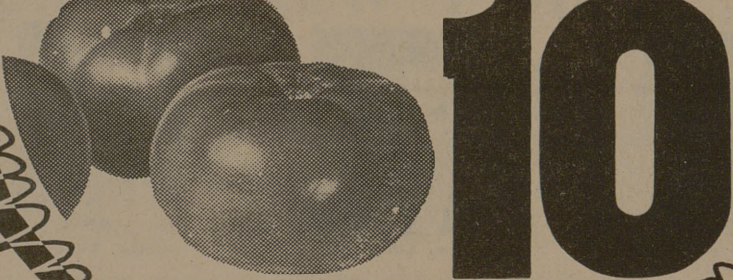

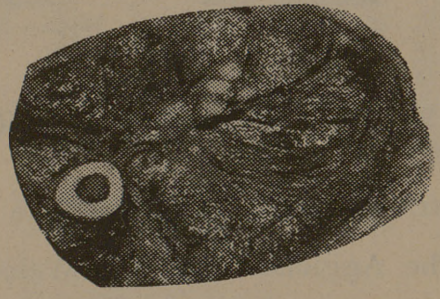
