Officials Meet Begins Sunday

A two-week, two-campus seminar for new and prospective academic administrators convenes at Texas A&M Sunday.

Forty college and university presidents, vice presidents, deans, department heads and key administration officers will participate in the training session co-hosted by A&M and Trinity University in San Antonio.

Participants will hear addresses, make case studies and field trips and conduct group discussions and individual study. The seminar will shift to the Trinity campus July 2 for the second week.

"The seminar will provide administrators with views of a large public land-grant university, a small private liberal aarts college and other variations," explained Associate Director Jack W. Humphries. He said participants will visit Sam Houston State next week and San Antonio College during July 2-8.

The program, focusing on concepts and practices of higher education administration, is sponsored by the Association of Texas Colleges and Universityies, College and University System Coordinating Board, Trinity and A&M.

Among featured speakers are Dr. Jack K. Williams, Coordinating Board commissioner; Ohio University President Dr. Vern Aldren; the Dun and Bradstreet chairman, Dr. John Corson, and Dr. David C. Knapp, American Council on Education official.

A&M President Earl Rudder and Liberal Arts Dean Frank Hubert will welcome participants via video tape. Academic Vice President Wayne C. Hall will extend a personal welcome.

Seminar sessions at A&M will be held in the Richard Coke Building. Participants will stay and hold buffets in the Memorial Student Center.

At Trinity, sessions will meet in the Sams Memorial Center.

\$53,435 Granted To Water Control Training Program Texas A&M has been awarded

Texas A&M has been awarded a \$53,435 renewal grant for training in water supply and pollution

Provided by the Federal Water Pollution Control Administration of the Department of Interior, the grant is directed by Dr. Roy W. Hann Jr., associate head of the Environmental Engineering Division of A&M's Civil Engineering Department.

A division spokesman said the grant finances a board-based interdisciplinary program to train personnel for careers in the water pollution control field.

Program leaders solicit applicants from chemistry, biology, and various engineering fields and provide them with a foundation in the basic sciences related to pollution control.

Trainees are urged to use knowledge derived from a strong engineering program to solve current problems.

Particular emphasis, the spokesman noted, is given to problems associated with wastes from petro-chemical industry and the effect of such wastes on aquatic systems to which they are discharged.

Twenty students worked toward these specialized degrees under the last grant. An estimate was not immediately available regarding the number of trainees who will receive stipends during the coming year.

The program is scheduled through June 30, 1969.

Civil Defense Sets Course At Air Base

A Civil Defense shelter management instructors' course by Texas A&M's Engineering Extension Service is set July 25-27 at Carewell Air Force Base in Fort Worth.

Dr. Willis R. Bodine, chief instructor of A&M's Civil Defense Training Division, said 30 Carswell AFB representatives and citizens from surrounding cities will participate in the school which includes an overnight stay in a community fallout shelter.

Emphasis in the school, Bodine noted, is on methods, techniques and procedures of planning, organizing and conducting local shelter management training programs

Clark Titus and Bill Tidball of the TEES staff will teach the course.




