Grant Of \$12,760

Texas A&M has been awarded a \$12,760 National Science Foundation grant to conduct a summer research participation program for college teachers of civil engineering.

Dr. Charles H. Samson, A&M Civil Engineering Department head, directs the program geared to acquaint four full-time college teachers with current research programs. Dr. William B. Ledbetter, civil engineering assistant professor, is associate director of the program.

Dr. Samson said the 12-week program under guidance of civil engineering faculty members prepares teachers to conduct research programs at their home institutions.

A&M has received similar NSF grants for the past two summers. Participants in 1967 research came from Merrimack College, University of Missouri at Rolla, University of South Carolina, and Prairie View A&M.




