The Texas Aggie soccer team is back in action Saturday and, with increased help from the administration, this season promises to be a successful one.

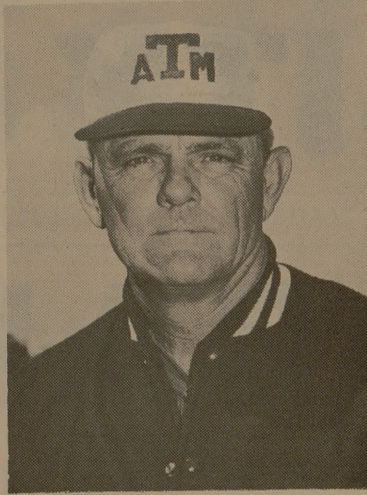

## Fish Gridders Begin Practice

Texas A&M freshman football coach Jake Helms typifies the 57 young hopefuls who turned out Monday for the first day of practice as "boys with real good attitudes who are really working."

Forty-three of the freshman squad members are attending on athletic scholarships, including three high school All-Americans and 10 all-taters.

Dave Elmendorf, a 6-1, 185-pounder from Houston Westbury, was a high school All-American back as was 6-2, 185-pound Marc Black from Roswell, N.M. Mike DeNiro, a 6-0, 195-pound end from Youngstown, Ohio, was an All-American at that position.

The job confronting Coach Helms at the present time is finding the proper position for each player and the best player for each position.

"It's too early to tell who's going to be doing what," he commented. He emphasized that the Fish football team would more than likely not be molded into the shape he wanted until about Oct. 4. The only trouble is that the first freshman game is Oct. 5 against Texas Christian in Kyle Field.

This year's team will be Helms' third at A&M. His 1965 squad turned in a disappointing 1-4 record while last year's Fish produced a respectable 2-2-1.

## Ags Make Changes For Purdue Game

Coach Gene Stallings' Texas Aggies football team goes into its second game of the year tomorrow with a 'change for the better' attitude.

The Purdue Boilermakers will be the competition in a 7:30 night

game at Dallas' Cotton Bowl Saturday.

The defensive team will look slightly different from last week's opener with Southern Methodist. The offense should stay the same.

Stallings wasn't commenting specifically on the defense changes but said he was trying to find people who could do the job. The Aggie defense was only able to get to the SMU quarterback once last Saturday and there was also a lack of adequate pursuit. These are two of the things Stallings hopes to change with his player moves.

The defense then remains a question mark until game-time but the offensive lineup is set. It shapes up with Edd Hargett leading the team at quarterback with Bill Sallee and Wendell Housley set at the running back spots. Bob Long will be at the wing back position with Tommy Maxwell and Tommy Buckman at the ends.

The interior line will have Jack Kovar at center and Mark Weaver and Mo Moorman at the guards and Dan Schneider and Rolf Krueger lining up at tackle.

Purdue is the biggest team that the Aggies will face this season. Both the offensive and defensive lines have many 200-plus-pounders. Best of the defense should be 226-pound junior middle guard Chuck Kyle and senior tackle Lance Olssen, a 257-pound product.

On the offense, Perry Williams and Leroy Keyes shape up as the one-two punch that a team needs to win.

A tough game in store for the Aggies.

## Collins Leads In T-Bird Golf

CLIFTON, N.J. (AP)—Bill Collins, a strapping ex-Marine whose aches and pains drove him off the tour three years ago, sank king-sized putts on the first three holes and leap-frogged over golf's glamour boys for the first-round lead Thursday in the \$150,000 Thunderbird Classic.

The 6-foot-4, 205-pound teaching pro from the Brae Burn Club in Purchase, N.Y., ran down putts of from 14 to 30 feet in a quick explosion of birdies and sank another from 50 feet on the 10th for a 32-35-67 over the 7,005-yard par-72 Upper Montclair course.

This gave Collins a one-stroke edge over Homero Blancas, 29-year-old Mexican-American from Houston and Ryder Cupper Johnny Pott, tied at 68.

Five others, including the always dangerous Bill Casper, were bracketed at 69 in a tight traffic jam at the top of the list of 122 golfers, but absent from the leaders were the names of the favorites Jack Nicklaus and Arnold Palmer.

Nicklaus, the season's leading money winner, who thrives on \$50,000 checks, shot a 72 and Palmer, Jack's close pursuer in the money race, settled for a 71.

The University of North Dakota hockey team is captained by Jerry Lafond, defenseman from Dawson Creek, B.C., and wingman Dave Janaway of Portage La Prairie, Man.
