## \$50,000 Grant Given By NASA To Design Study

NASA has awarded Texas A&M a \$50,000 grant for continuation of a research project which could affect the design of future spacecraft.

Dr. James A. Stricklin, principal investigator for the project, said the research involves numerical programs relating to thermal loads on a spacecraft's aft heat shield and stress caused by dynamic loading.

The Texas A&M aerospace engineering professor initiated the structural research project last year under a \$33,528 grant from the space agency.

NASA's Manned Spacecraft Center at Houston is currently using a numerical program developed at Texas A&M to analyze the static behavior of the aft shield on the Apollo spacecraft.

Dr. Stricklin is assisted in the project by graduate students Walter Haisler and Jose DeAndrade and several undergraduates.



