## EE Major Given \$500 Scholarship

Bryan T. Preas of Cooper received the second edition of an Armed Forces Electronics and Communications Association scholarship here Thursday.

The \$500 check was presented to the senior electrical engineering major by President Earl Ruder in the presence of Preas' parents and Electrical Engineering Department officials.

Dr. Glen D. Hallmark, A&M electrical engineering professor and AFCEA member, said Preas' selection for the award last year was unusual.

"To be selected the second year in a row is rare," the professor remarked.

The award is one of four given annually in the nation. Winners are selected on the basis of merit for undergraduate study of electrical, electronic or communications engineering. The country's 247 universities conducting senior division ROTC programs nominate candidates.

Preas, a senior in Company G-1 in the Corps of Cadets, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. O. T. Preas, 311 Northwest First, Cooper. The

two-year AFCEA scholarship winner has maintained a perfect 3.0 grade point ratio and is member of the Society of American Military Engineers.

The All-Aggie Rodeo opens tonight at Texas A&M University, with a second performance set Saturday afternoon.

The association is designed to provide closer student-faculty relationship and help the student prepare for a professional career through exposure to various fields of psychology.

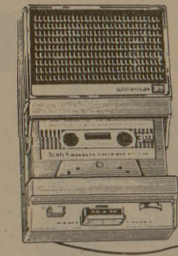
Association sponsor is Dr. James M. Elliott, assistant professor in the Psychology Department.

Discover for yourself this security! In your church you can find those eternal values if you trust in the security of Him who cannot fail.

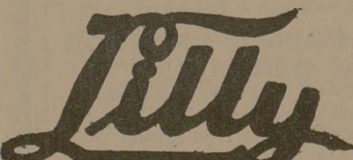
