Civil Defense fallout shelters and other buildings capable of shelter space in Brazos County will be surveyed in the next three weeks.

U. S. Army Corps of Engineer officials from Fort Worth will conduct the survey to locate new shelter space and usable water in existing facilities. Civil engineers Arthur F. Jones and Charles V. Dansby will make the appraisal.

"We're very happy to have Jones and Dansby with us," commented Jake Canglose, Brazos County CD director. "They are conducting a much needed phase of our Civil Defense program."

"We will look at every building previously listed as shelters and at new construction," Jones explained. "The availability of usable water is one of the principal features of the survey. Water is often trapped in a building, in interior piping, storage facilities and so forth. Recording the location of such water is one pur-

"The upgrading phase will also take into account new buildings Research Architect and other structures that may shelter occupants. Reports on these structures will also be

The survey will be concentrated at Texas A&M, which has the largest complex of buildings in Brazos County.

Brazos County has shelter space for just over 20,000 persons marked and stocked, Canglose pointed out. Location of the CD shelters is listed in a pamphlet available at all post offices.


