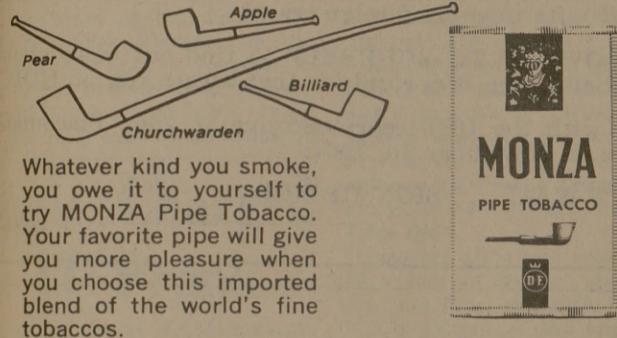

Weirus To Speak To Alumni Group

SAN ANTONIO—Mr. Richard Weirus, executive director of Texas A&M's Association of Former Students will be the banquet speaker this weekend at the 44th annual convention of the International Federation of Catholic Alumnae, Texas Chapter. The HemisFair City convention will be hosted by Incarnate Word College.

Mr. Weirus will address the delegates on Saturday night in the College's dining hall. His topic is "Should the Alumna Care?"

IFCA is an organization of graduates from Catholic high schools, junior colleges, colleges, universities, and schools of nursing. They are engaged in various social service programs and scholarship foundations.

The Nov. 10-12 convention will offer lectures and workshops on literature, motion pictures, and social work.

Also attending the convention will be Mrs. H. R. Purcell of Houston, IFCA president.

Baptist Program Features Hurlbut

Jack Hurlbut, quarterback coach for the Texas A&M football team, will speak during a "World Scope" program Saturday at the Baptist Student Union in College Station.

The program is set for 10 a.m., announced BSU Director Bob Burch.

"World Scope" is designed to give international students an opportunity to exchange ideas and customs as well as to understand more about the United States, Burch explained.

Craig Hay, international student chairman for the BSU, said regular "World Scope" programs are planned each Saturday, with refreshments to follow each meeting.

Miss Kathleen Johnson, BSU assistant director, said 41 students attended the first "World Scope" presentation last Saturday. International students assisting in the "World Scope" program include Estaban Salinas, Ramon de Leon and Paul Jival.

Hurlbut, member of College Station's First Baptist Church, joined the A&M coaching staff in December, 1964, after a short stint of coaching football and swimming at Galveston.

A native of Houston, Hurlbut was a versatile athlete at Aldine High School, competing in football, basketball, track and baseball. After playing freshman football at Rice, he transferred to Alabama University where he was a quarterback and defensive half-back for three years.
