Ags-Longhorns May Make TV

TYLER (AP)—General Manager Marshall Pengra of television station KLTW said Monday he was asking ABC to televise the Texas-Texas A&M football game Thanksgiving Day.

Pengra said his station was receiving a steady stream of telephone calls urging the station to televise the game and that he expected all television stations in the state would be besieged with calls and letters.

He said every effort would be made to get ABC to do a state-wide telecast.

The game is a sellout and will not interfere with any other college game in the allowable radius.

If approved, it would mark the second time this year for TV exposure for both teams. A&M met Southern Methodist in ABC's season opener on Sept. 16 while Texas played Arkansas before a national audience on Oct. 21.

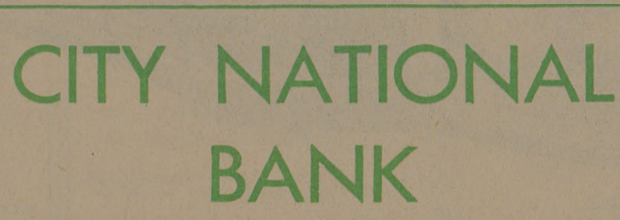
