It appears that despite the Turkey Day doings, the University of Texas has out-snookered the Aggies when it comes to post-season bowl games.

While the Aggies are managing to send only one team to a bowl, the Cotton Bowl, the University of Texas is sending two teams 'bowl'ing.

The University of Texas at Arlington (the north campus) is going to play in the Pecan Bowl in Abilene, Kansas, and the west campus, the University of Texas at El Paso, is going to play in the Sun Bowl in El Paso.

The only University of Texas campus falling short of a bowl game is the southern campus, the one in Austin. The failure of the Austin branch to compare in football with the other campuses could result in its expulsion from the University of Texas System.

But meanwhile back in the Southwest Conference.

It's just about all over, except for the shouting and a little bit of shuffling about of teams down in the ranks.

To the champion Texas Aggies went lots of the statistical spoils, but in the incongruous race of 1967 most of them were of the individual variety. As a team, A&M finished first only in war. They lost virtually all of the team stats battles, ranking last in per-
