

Phone Threat Helps Thicken Murder Plot

SAN ANGELO (AP) — The investigation of an alleged plot to assassinate Arkansas Gov. Winthrop Rockefeller took several dramatic turns Thursday with the appearance of the central figure in the case and a phoned threat to the wife of a reporter. Police Chief Melvin James of San Angelo and detective Loil Galentine hustled Zakar Garoogian, 34, back into San Angelo after a disappearance of about 24 hours.

THERE WERE reports the men could have taken Garoogian to Arkansas for questioning by officers there. Garoogian, identified as a drifter being held in connection with the robbery of a soft drink bottling firm at San Angelo, was jailed without comment.

Stephen Brown, a reporter for the San Angelo Standard-Times which published the first news of an alleged plot, said a male voice using obscenities called his wife. Brown said the caller told his wife: "Unless Brown drops pursuit of news in the assassination attempt, his wife and son would be interested in the consequences."

THE STANDARD-TIMES had reported earlier in the week that Garoogian had been quoted by well informed sources as saying that he had information about a plan to kill Rockefeller.

It was also learned from unofficial sources, but confirmed by one in authority, that Garoogian had been approached by gambling interests who suggested sabotage to one of Rockefeller's private planes.

James said Thursday that the assassination plot "has substantial underworld backing." James said the alleged plot was "valid, true and authentic."

HE SAID HE couldn't say whether charges would be filed in the case. James said Arkansas authorities now had all the information and that charges would have to come from "that end." James became embroiled in a hassle with defense attorney Jack Ray of San Angelo on whether Garoogian's rights were being violated.

Ray said Garoogian "was interviewed by officers from two states without my knowledge and without my being notified. Further, he was interviewed out of state, again without my being notified."

James said Garoogian's rights "were not violated." He said Garoogian "can waive the counsel, which he did. He was warned of his rights."

Army Fights Cuts On Reserve Budget

WASHINGTON (AP) — Budget planners want to slash funds for training key National Guard and Reserve units. The Army is fighting the move.

Budget planners seek to slash \$52 million from funds proposed for training and supporting a 150,000-man force of Army National Guard and Reserve units which would be the first called up in a war emergency, Pentagon sources said Thursday.

THE RESULT as they picture it would be to stretch from eight to about 12 weeks the time in which high-priority Guard and Reserve units would be ready for deployment after being mobilized.

In addition to limiting training, the money cut would reduce supply purchases for the Selected Reserve Force.

The issue is being debated as Pentagon officials shape the defense budget President Johnson will send to Congress next month.

ARMY OFFICIALS are reported arguing strongly for retention of the \$52 million. Some sources predict they will be upheld by top Pentagon authorities.

There is strong pressure throughout the defense establishment to hold down on any spending unrelated to the Vietnam war.

Defense authorities say the fighting edge of the Reserve forces will be further sharpened by this third major shakeup of the Guard and Reserve structure under Secretary of Defense Robert S. McNamara.
