"It is the firm view of the subcommittee that adequate search and surveillance measures are not being carried out," Rep. L. Mendel Rivers, D.-S.C., said in a speech for the House. "Immediate steps should be taken to correct these intolerable situations.'

Rivers, chairman of the parent committee, relayed this and other recommendations to the House for the special unit which since Nov. 24 has been traveling throughout the Pacific and Southeast Asian area.

He said the interim, informal report also offers these points: . . The military effort in

Vietnam is making progress but at too slow a rate.

. Any temporary cessation of bombing can only be to the disadvantage of the United States, a view it said agrees with the overwhelming judgment of military commanders in the

The military should be permitted to designate as primary targets air defenses including sophisticated antiaircraft batteries and Soviet-supplied surfaceto-air missiles.

... Haiphong is the principal point of entry for war materials and this must not be permitted to continue.

. . Additional South Vietnamese troops must be trained and equipped promptly.

Rivers said the unit's final report on its still uncompleted study probably will not be made for some months. It is headed by Rep. Porter Hardy, D.-Va.
