

Poll Names Yaz Athlete Of Year

NEW YORK (AP)—Carl Yastrzemski, in the spotlight most of last summer while powering the underdog Boston Red Sox to the American League pennant, was named Male Athlete of the Year for 1967 by an overwhelming margin Wednesday in the annual Associated Press poll.

The AL's triple crown winner and its Most Valuable Player collected 210 first-place votes and 870 points in the balloting by 376 sports writers and broadcasters. Points were awarded on a basis of three for a first-place vote, two for second and one for third.

John Unitas of the Baltimore Colts, the National Football League's MVP, placed second with 267 points. Jim Ryun, who

broke his own record for the mile run, was third with 237.

Next in order came pro golf star Jack Nicklaus; O. J. Simpson, ace halfback of Southern California's national champion college football team, and Lew Alcindor, the 7-foot-1½ center who led UCLA to the national college basketball title. Nicklaus had 158 points, Simpson 147 and Alcindor 111.

Rounding out the first 10 were Orlando Cepeda of baseball's St. Louis Cardinals, the National League's MVP; Gary Beban of UCLA, the Heisman Trophy winner as college football's outstanding player; Daryle Lamonia, quarterback of Oakland's American Football League title-holders, and Leroy Kelly of the Cleveland Browns, the NFL rushing leader.

Yastrzemski is the 15th baseball player to be named the top male athlete since the award was originated in 1931. The 1966 winner was Frank Robinson of the Baltimore Orioles, who also took the AL's triple crown. The first winner was Pepper Martin of the St. Louis Cardinals.

Last season, Yastrzemski paced the circuit with a .326 batting average, 121 runs batted in and tied Minnesota's Harmon Killebrew for most home runs, 44.
