



PHILADELPHIA (AP) - Bob Lanier, 6-foot-5 sophomore saved fifth-ranked St. Bonaventure's unbeaten basketball record Wednesday night with a pair of clutch baskets that beat Villanova 66-

The Bonnies gained their 16th straight victory and snapped Villanova's 9-game string after blowing a nine-point lead in the second half.
