Russians Move Ships In Into Korean Waters

WASHINGTON (A)-The Rus- Pueblo and the 82 survivors of her sians have moved a force of warships into Korean waters where American fighting ships have been concentrated on the Pueblo

Government sources said Wednesday there are 10 or 15 soviet warships in the area, including cruisers, destroyers and frigates. They are believed to have come from Vladivostok, Russia's main Far East naval base.

Meanwhile, the United States has withdrawn the giant 85,000ton aircraft carrier Enterprise from the Sea of Japan, leaving behind two other carriers, destroyers and support ships in a force of about 20 U.S. vessels.

THE SOURCES, disclosing these developments, said there was no connection between the presence of the Soviet ships and the withdrawal of the Enterprise. But they conceded the action could create the impression of a partial American pullback in the face of Soviet naval pressure.

Withdrawal of the Enterprise to the southern fringe of the Korean Strait was tied by some U.S. sources to diplomatic moves aimed at getting Communist North Korea to return the intelligence ship areas.


