

## NFO Withholds Meat From Sale

DES MOINES, Iowa (AP)—A 35-state grain market boycott by the National Farmers Organization was extended to meat Monday in the second phase of an all-commodity withholding action aimed at boosting prices.

The meat embargo was called one month after the NFO instructed its members to hold corn, oats, wheat, rye, soybeans and sorghums off the market until prices reached predetermined levels.

THE FINAL PHASE of the action, a milk sales boycott, is planned at an as yet unscheduled date, said NFO president Oren Lee Staley.

The organization urged its members to hold cattle, hogs and sheep from packing houses until prices rise as much as six cents a pound.

"WE'RE PREPARED to hold whatever time it takes," said Staley. "How long the action lasts will depend on the desire of the packing industry to fight."

The militant farmer group wants cattle prices increased from 26 to 32 cents per pound, hog prices up from 19 to 23 cents and sheep from 23 to 29 cents.

Staley said members would offer contracts only to those meat packers "willing to sign and pay the price."

### Pentagon Studies Weapons Against Hostile Satellites

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Pentagon said Monday it has been studying various new ways to destroy hostile satellites but "no decision has been made to develop a new weapons system" against them.

The Washington Post reported earlier the United States had decided to develop a weapon to knock down enemy satellites. The satellite threat got fresh attention late last year when Secretary of Defense Robert S. McNamara disclosed the Soviet Union was developing a fractional orbital bombardment system FOBS.

FOBS actually is a satellite-type bomb which is launched into sub-orbit and then is ordered to descend to earth before completing a full circuit of the earth.

### Star Party Slated By A&M Society

Observations will highlight a Brazos Valley Astronomical Society meeting at Texas A&M Wednesday.

The 7:30 p.m. star party-business meeting will be in Room 145 of the Physics Building, announced Jim Thomas of Baytown, society president.

Member telescopes will be trained on the full moon, nebulae and planets following a brief business meeting. Thomas said the program will also feature a 25-minute, black-and-white sound film, "The Universe."

### Campus Recruiting Slated For AEC

Representatives of the Atomic Energy Commission's college recruitment program will be on the

Texas A&M University campus February 15 as part of the AEC's continuing search for outstanding young candidates in the fields of management, engineering, and the physical sciences.

Interviews are being scheduled now through the Placement Office. The agency has about 200 openings for men and women with a "B" average, or in the upper 25% of their class, who will earn Bachelor's or Master's degrees in 1968.

While AEC will make its selection on a nationwide basis, there will be no written examination. Those selected will be notified a few weeks after the interview.

The Atomic Energy Commission conducts research and development programs into the use of nuclear energy to produce electricity, desalt seawater, power space vehicles, conduct medical research, sterilize food, and defend the Nation, among many others. It also licenses private uses of atomic energy, fosters

basic research into the nature of the atom and promotes international cooperation in the peaceful uses of atomic energy.

### Vietnam Veteran Finishes Training

A Vietnam veteran and Texas A&M graduate, Army Maj. Edward J. Bunn of Dallas, has completed five months study at the Armed Forces Staff College at Norfolk, Va.

Major Bunn studied combined operations planning and armed forces organization for national and international security. The college is operated by the Joint Chiefs of Staff for the Department of Defense.

The major holds the Air Medal, two awards each of the Bronze Star Medal and Commendation Medal and the Vietnamese Gallantry Cross. He studied geology at A&M, graduating and receiving his commission in 1966.

## Valentines To Take Six Cents This Year

Postage for all valentines one ounce or lighter is six cents, Postmaster Ernest Gregg reminded mailers today.

The first-class postage rate will provide jet flight service for valentines destined to servicemen in Vietnam and other overseas locations as well as airlift treatment for most domestic addresses more than 250 miles from the mailing point.

Legislation which went into effect January 7, eliminated the four-cent rate for greeting cards.
