Council Plans Engineer Week

The Student Engineer's Council has declared the week beginning March 8 as A&M Engineers' Week. The activities begin on Friday, March 8, with the annual Junior Engineering Technical Society Conference followed by High School Career Day. Career Day is the yearly effort of the Engineers' Council to acquaint the prospective freshman with the superior facilities of A&M's College of Engineering. Each department in the College of Engineering will display what their respective department encompasses, and provide a guided tour of each department's facilities.

Harry E. Bovay, president of the Texas Society of Professional Engineers, will address the senior engineering students at 4 p.m. on March 14 in a seminar on professional engineering in the Architecture Lecture Room. The purpose of this and other seminars is to encourage young engineers to join their peers in promoting the engineering profession by becoming Registered Professional Engineers.

The Engineers' Council will sponsor a picnic and steak fry at Hensel Park from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. on March 16 with serving times from 11-1 p.m. Since the picnic is sandwiched between the Association and Junior Ball, it is advised to bring a date. Tickets are \$1.50 and are available through the Dean of Engineering's Office or various departmental offices, including ME, IE, EE, IEd, CE, ChE, and Aero. Interdepartmental competition and eliminations will include a tug-of-war and a volleyball game.

Keynote idea of the Engineers' Week will be the fact that St. Patrick was an engineer. St. Patrick's Day is Sunday, March 17.
