# HemisFair To **Begin State Talent Hunt**

Young people with performing talents will have an opportunity to try out for appearances in HemisFair's "Project Y" Sunday, March 10, at the University of Houston.

The Houston auditions, open to all young people from 13 up, are part of a statewide search for talent to appear at Project Y, a fair area designed to present the concerns and creative activities of young people.

The auditions will be held from 11:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. at the Houston Room in the University Center, with officials searching for talent to appear during the April 6-Oct. 6 San Antonio World's Fair.

Emphasis will be on musical groups, both vocal and instrumental, folk singers and dancers.

"Quality will have to be high because these young people are competing, in effect, with groups scheduled to come from other parts of the United States and Latin America." Jim Wharton. producer for the Project Y Cabaret, said.

The only payment those selected will receive is free admission to HemisFair.

Future auditions include Dallas, March 16, and Laredo, March

Project Y includes a broad range of activities-painting and sculpture under the trees, workshops and discussions with visiting personalities, theatrical performances, sports and games, musical jam sessions. There will be a continuous program of special events, including festivals, improvisational theater, parades and contests.
