Castro Admits Cash Troubles

HAVANA (AP)-Prime Minister Fidel Castro put aside international matters Wednesday night to explain Cuba's economic difficulties to the country.

Admitting Cuba is in financial trouble, Castro told a nation-wide radio and television audience and a crowd of several thousand at Havana University that Cubans would overcome their problems although the path would not be easy.

Communist Cuba is facing a year of shortages because of a poor sugar harvest brought on by a severe drought last year. The drought also forced the government to further restrict tightly rationed milk supplies in Havana.

Castro derided what he described as rumors that bread is to be rationed and that there is a shortage of school supplies.

Hutt Named Visiting Prof

William H. Hutt, professor emeritus at the University of Cape Town, South Africa, has been appointed visiting professor in Texas A&M's Department of Economics, Dr. M. L. Greenhut, department head, announced.

Appointment of the former dean of the faculty of commerce at Cape Town is effective September 1. Hutt also served as director of the Graduate School of Business Administration at Cape Town. He was elected professor emeritus in 1965.

Hutt has lectured extensively in the United States. He is author of more than 40 articles on theoretical and applied economics. His publications span 40 years and have appeared in many economic journals

In addition, Hutt has written five academic level books including the well-received "Keynesianism-Retrospect and Prospect" in 1963. Newsweek magazine called this work "one of the most penetrating and important economic books of the last 25 years."

Hutt is a former president of the Economic Society of South Africa. He has a close interest in student affairs. Hutt served as chairman of the Students' Visiting Lecturers Fund while at Cape Town and also president of the South African Universities Soccer Association.

Mrs. Hutt, a native of Cape Town, is an artist specializing in African themes. She has exhibited her work in the United States.
