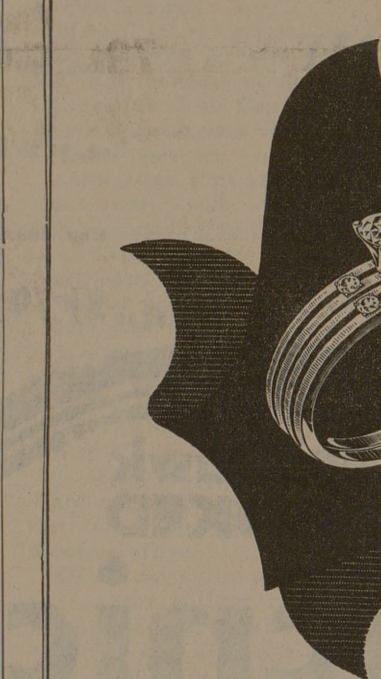

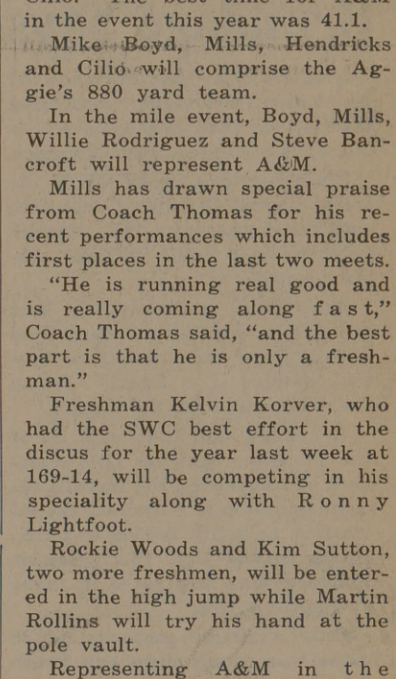
Tracksters Invade Iowa; Matson In California Meet
