Strange Blackbird May Be Trouble

Are crackles friends or foes of farmers and ranchers? Dr. Keith Arnold, assistant professor of wildlife science at Texas A&M, seeks the answer through research supported by A&M and the U. S. Hatch Fund.

Arnold and graduate student Walter Davis of Irving are banding crackles in the Bryan-College Station area this spring.

Arnold said crackles may do more good for farmers and ranchers by helping control the insect population.

"What would happen to corn, rice and other big grain crops if the crackles didn't eat insect larvae?" he pondered.

"Some authorities say crackles, members of the blackbird family, cause a minimum of \$6 million crop damage in Texas alone," Arnold said.

"We are finding that crackles eat a lot of moths and insect larvae," he continued.

Arnold said crackles may do more good for farmers and ranchers by helping control the insect population.

Department Seeking Top Professors

Dr. William C. Gibbons, head of Texas A&M's new Political Science Department, will go any length to recruit top professors—even getting Red Cross help in contacting a prospect in Vietnam.

Case in point is that of Robert Clark Jr., Phi Beta Kappa at Tulane and recipient of a Ph.D. from Johns (cq) Hopkins University's School of Advanced International Studies.

Following several bizarre communication attempts, Texas A&M received confirmation last week that Clark, an Army captain stationed at Cam Ranh Bay, South Vietnam, will join the university's faculty when he completes his service in July.

Gibbons explained he had received glowing reports about Clark and understood several institutions were negotiating with him.

"I figured I had to get in touch with him in a hurry," Gibbons noted.

Gibbons, himself newly arrived at A&M from the Agency for International Development's Congressional liaison staff in Washington, initially attempted to contact Clark through the Defense Department, but communication bogged down.

He then tried to phone Clark with equally poor results. The telephone people, he recalled, were less than optimistic from the start, pointing out Clark would have to hitchhike to Saigon to take the call.

Next came a try at cable service. It was never confirmed that the wire went through.

As a last resort, Gibbons wrote Clark a letter and hoped for the best.

"After that, I just sat and waited and got very frustrated," Gibbons recalled.

"Had visions of him taking another job before I had the opportunity to contact him."

Just when Gibbons had almost given up, he received a call from Mrs. D. W. Howell, Bryan-College Station area Red Cross representative, who had just been contacted by the organization's headquarters in Washington.

She was happy to inform Gibbons his cable had reached Clark and that he had accepted the position.

Clark, whose wife and parents reside in Houston, is 27, a native of Oklahoma and a specialist in Latin American affairs.

entering the Army, he served as an assistant to a White House staff member who was preparing a book on political development.

Come September, Clark will be an assistant professor and face a host of eager Aggies totally unaware of the effort to get him.

"The trouble was worth it," Gibbons emphasized. "We landed our man and are very pleased."

"Next time, I'll try the Red Cross first," he quipped. Gibbons added, however, he was glad he didn't have such problems getting other professors for his new department.
