Aggies everywhere heaved huge sigh of relief Saturday as
the Southwest Conference Faculty Athletic Committee cleared A\&M's football program of 13

and issued a reprimand on the and issued a

wrist and carries no sanctions wrist and car
against A\&M.
The violations were all con-
cerned with the giving of complicerned with the giving of compli-
mentary tickets to prospects for mentary tickets to prospects for
away games and for the paying of travel expenses to places other
than the athlete's home or the than the athlete's home or the

relatively light penalty, accord-
ing to ing to Dr. Monroe S. Carroll

"We considered the offen much lighter than the one in 1965 and the penalty was in pe
