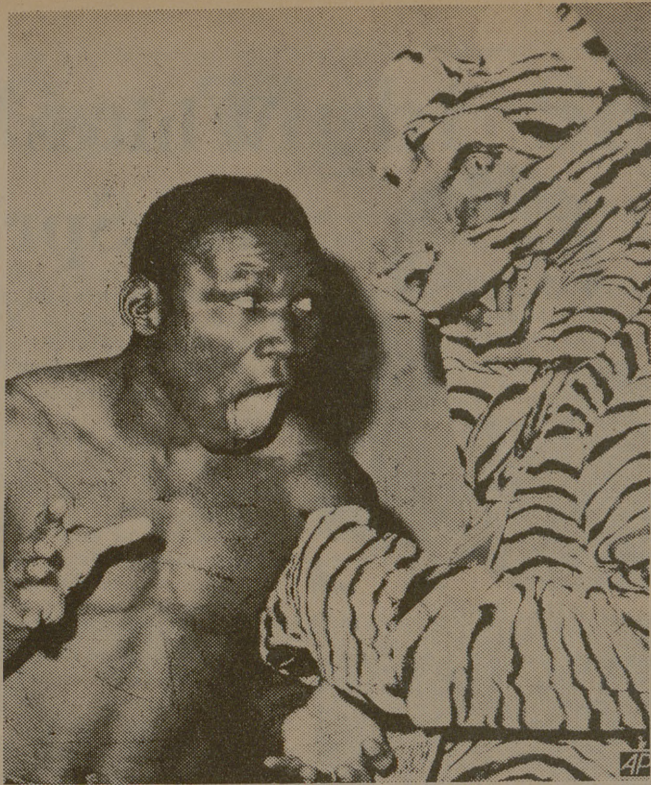

Don May Joins NBA

Knicks Sign Dayton Star

NEW YORK (AP) — The New York Knicks have corralled Don May of Dayton, the star of the most recent National Invitation Basketball Tournament, and they may owe it all to Arthur Morse's reputation as a tough negotiator.

"I now own one-sixth of the Knicks," Morse boasted while chuckling Wednesday after May was signed to a contract by the National Basketball Association team.

Morse, a Chicago attorney who represents basketball and football players in negotiations with professional teams, was referring to

May and Cazzie Russell, another of his clients.

Russell, the former Michigan All-America, signed with the Knicks for a reported \$200,000 in 1966.

May was the Knicks' second draft choice but 32nd over-all in the NBA's annual selection of college players earlier this month.

"I was told by Don Richman of Seattle that the reason they didn't pick him was because I represented him and that I was too tough," Morse disclosed. Richman was the SuperSonics' general manager until shortly after the draft when he resigned.

"No, May's contract was not as good as the one that Cazzie got, but it's a good one for both sides," Morse said. "He's a quiet kid but a good, tough player."

May led the Flyers to the 1968

NIT title in New York in May of this year. The new Knick named most valuable player the tournament.

His scoring totals for his three years at Dayton, broke the school's scoring record that formerly held by Henry Fike. Though only 6-4, May was Dayton's top rebounder two years ago.

Lefthander Denny Lemaster, the first Houston pitcher to win four games this season, will be on the mound Friday night as the Astros return home to open a four-game weekend series against the Los Angeles Dodgers.

The series marks the first time the Astrodom visit for the popular Dodgers. They'll be here for games Friday night, Saturday night, Sunday afternoon and Monday night.

Lemaster will face Los Angeles' Don Sutton in the 7:30 p.m. Friday opener. Denny stopped the Dodgers, 2-1, in the first game of last Sunday's doubleheader in Los Angeles.

Mike Cuellar, Houston's lefthanded ace who was slowed by arm trouble early this year, will get the nod for the Astros in Saturday's 7:30 p.m. game. Cuellar, who beat the Dodgers 3-1 in the second game of the doubleheader Sunday, will be matched against Bill Singer, who put a 6-0 shutout on Houston Friday.

Don Wilson is slated for Houston pitching duties in the 12 p.m. game on Sunday. He'll be matched against Don Drysdale, the Dodgers' all-time winning pitcher. Drysdale blanked the Astros 1-0 last Saturday, while Wilson will be getting his first win shot at the Dodgers.

The Monday series finale will find Larry Dierker on the hill for the Astros, while lefthander Claude Osteen will be the Dodgers' selection. Both were losing pitchers during the four-game series on the West Coast last week.

Sunday, which is "Keds Day" and "Family Day" at the Astrodom, will be the series highlight. Kids 16 and under will be eligible for valuable free gifts and will receive a \$1 reduction on baseball tickets when accompanied by a parent.

After Monday's game, the Astros will leave for a quick three-game visit to Atlanta, then will be back in the Astrodom on Friday, May 31, to open an 11-game home stand (through June 1) against Chicago, St. Louis and Pittsburgh.
