

Briefs ... Registration Set For Sea School

A record 112 spring high school graduates and college freshmen have signed on for Texas A&M's European "Summer School at Sea."

Adm. James D. Craik, superintendent of A&M's Texas Maritime Academy, said enrollment for the June 12-Aug. 18 program is almost double last year's total. "Summer School at Sea," now in its fourth year, offers students an opportunity to earn six hours of college credit while visiting six foreign ports.

Following a three-day orientation at TMA facilities at Galveston, the students cast off June 15 aboard the "Texas Clipper," a 15,000-ton oceanliner converted to a floating classroom.

European ports of call on the 13,000-mile cruise are Oslo, Norway; Amsterdam, Netherlands; Lisbon, Portugal, and Gibraltar.

The "Clipper" will stop at New York enroute and return via the Canary Islands and San Juan, Puerto Rico.

"Summer School at Sea" students will be joined on the cruise by 124 TMA cadets who will be participating in their annual summer training for degrees in marine engineering or marine transportation.

The "Summer School at Sea" program is jointly sponsored by A&M's College of Liberal Arts and TMA.

Aggie Is Picked For Intern Post

Harry Ledbetter of Breckenridge, a former Texas A&M quarterback, has been named a legislative intern for the 1969 Texas Legislature.

Ledbetter, economics graduate student, is one of 12 persons announced for intern posts by House Speaker Ben Barnes.

The graduate assistant in A&M's community services seminar program was among outstanding graduate students selected to participate in a seminar on Texas politics and government. At the same time, Ledbetter will receive training in legislative research as part of the third annual Ford Foundation sponsored program.

An All-State quarterback at Breckenridge, Ledbetter played both offense and defense for the Aggies.

He earned a bachelor's degree in economics last year at A&M. An associate said Ledbetter plans to complete courses this summer, then work on a thesis concerning state government operations.

Ledbetter and his wife, Linda, have two daughters and live in Colliere Station. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. M. F. Ledbetter of Breckenridge.

Engineers Given Mobil Oil Grants

Claybourne pointed out that the money may be used in any fashion deemed appropriate to support the work of A&M faculty members and students.

Wortham said the department is conducting the seminar in conjunction with the University of Alabama. The department runs a maintainability engineering program at A&M and the Army's Red River Depot under Department of the Army contract.

Six students from the Red River program will present papers at the seminar, Wortham said.
