

Conservation Meet Slated For Campus

Approximately 75 representatives from the Soil Conservation Service and Texas A&M will meet July 15-16 on the campus for a cooperative conservation workshop, Dr. Clarence R. Carter, Extension soil and water conservation specialist, says.

The purpose of the workshop is to bring the two groups closer together and discuss problem areas needing further research, the specialist points out.

Albert Roach, State Soil and Water Conservation Board member, will give the main address at the Monday morning meeting of the workshop.

The group will discuss the effects of pesticides and flame cultivation on soils, erosion susceptibility and quality of run-off and ground water and water management for irrigation with limited water supplies.

Wildlife management in conjunction with livestock grazing management on rangelands and woodlands will also receive attention at the workshop, Dr. Carter concludes.
