Dr. Henry Randolph of the A&M Animal Science Depart-ment Dairy Section said Villar and Bejaran will prepare a class report on the trip.

The Kyana plant is a producer cooperative operation processing dry milk powder and butter, and the Armour plant is typical of those that manufacture milk pro-ducts (cheese, powder, condensed milk and butter.

Borden has two large plants in Columbus, Randolph added. One is a diversified milk and related products plant, and the other is fully automated for making ice

cream and other frozen desserts.




